

The actual design which as he and others have pointed out, resembles the Messerschmitt Me-209 which had some speed records to its credit. Ki-78 is quite a nice

hypothetical Sadly, as lovely the Kawasaki was in real life, it's speed performance was significantly short of the

mark, one could say it was "in the toilet", even.

introduce what Chris Bucholtz brought to share among other things! This complete upgrade kit he just got, is for correcting/accurizing Hasegawa's "special mark" edition of their delicious 1/72 A-1H Skyraider. The "special weapon" which was actually employed by a Skyraider in Korean War first, was "toilet bomb "Chris gave us a succinct review of all the fun that Seattle IPMS's Spring Show had to offer besides giving us a nice rendition of his latest works in progress. Which are his P-51D, P-47D, the A-1, and of course his "Snap 2 It Gruppe Build Project" early B-26.



As you see, sitting near Chris is our own prolific 1/48 builder, Ben Pada with a pair of nearly done lovelies, on foam beds.

One is an Eduard P-400 Pacific Theatre of Operations Airacobra, "Wahl Eye II", fits of this in the area of windscreen are no better (or worse) than those of early Monogram version or any Hasegawa edition, latest new molder of this bird. Oh well, Ben is not intimidated by any of it.

His Italian open cockpit radial threat is a Hasegawa original, I don't recall off hand the type. No matter, when Ben finishes it I'll make sure to note it and you can see it's a beauty already.



One more look at the decals which come to complete the set of brass and resin for the "special bomb" Skyraider.


Maybe silly to some, but I'm with Chris, re: more accuracy, the better for this version too.
