

This grand dragon type creation is what I faintly recall in hopefully correct fashion, from a 3-D print limited edition production. It's been made on behalf of its original owner by IPMS Santa Rosa (nee' Sonoma County) member and President, **Dev Sodagar**. He and (Hornet alumnus) IPMS SR member Jack Riggar came to our meeting to visit and share.

Those nice cards are updated promos for their club, which they gave details about the then upcoming auction for which I had been trying to promote for them as well, earlier.

Well, as I said, I was charmed entirely by the work and the tale of this beastie plus appreciated the travel of Dev and Jack. I was as well pleased that young Mr Kaminaga here along with his dad, made it to the meeting. I met them at the recent TC-14 event





Jack Riggar brought along this recent new kit in 1/48th of the Me-109. Again I wish I had better powers of recall to give even a








cursory worthwhile bit for everyone to get than these.

However, I can assure you he enjoyed the build and it was a recommend by him.

Well of course the laziest of effort by the Editor lead me to conclude that this kit's a Tamiya edition with these Mini magnets for engine bay covers. They were my scant clue from memory.

Okay now onto covering Chris Bucholtz's tabling.



Chris has a "pair kit" in 1/72nd scale of a WW2 German wheeled recon armored car, underway. Being of newer vintage, it's as



detailed in many ways in form of separate parts, as many 1/35th kits of same type have been for years.

I admire this from engineering as well as artistic standpoint as much as any, but I felt more akin to pain Chris expressed in relaying "fun" he was having taking this deuce modelling on.

Chris made quite a bit of progress on his project for the man on the camel since I had covered it last.

Those heads on tooth sticks are a bit further along in being done, I can not however be any more in assist than that for explaining.

The resin aircraft WIP of his, is the 1/72nd scale limited run kit by Muroc Models of the incredible research project by NASA of the Ames (Bay Area) and Dryden (in Edwards AFB area) labs in large cooperation with Mr Burt Rutan in design. It's the AD-1 Oblique Wing testbed, which proved in a convincing manner you could make an aircraft flyable with a wing that could swing on center axis quite a wide range and fly.

What it never seemed to solve was convincing anyone that paying air passengers would board an airliner so equipped... Alas.



With his college schedule allowing him to attend on this evening, new member young **Mr Larson** brought his pair of postwar USA and USSR armor (below)









Mr Larson provided insights to his choice of painting tools and supply, and although less often chosen for armor model builds, we assured him results well spoke for themselves.







Arriving a little later to the meeting, **Ron Darcy** again provided an extremely generous sharing of his Koster Aeroforms conversion set for creating accurate very early NA Mustang in 1/48th scale.

Ron's box of tricks here tells a story all by itself, no?






