





He had this lovely Takom 1/35th scale M103A in grey, his review of this kit entirely entranced me especially as he was familiar with the DML Black Label version I have, being a fan of this machine. He also helpfully made sure to have a new build Italeri M109A6 in 1/35th, for the club con.

I am sparing you all of my sampling shots of inside contents I took. This is a gorgeous piece of model literature indeed but also simply a grand buy as an art piece in itself.

Randy also of course had along his award winning WW 1 vehicle.





Alan O'Neal relayed here that he now felt this was "the finished product" with regards his Project Nashorn Dry Pigments experiment, that he launched after coming across an early 2000s vintage FineScale Modeler magazine article on the technique.



I really liked how Alan's Nashorn turned out. In lacking another good singled out shot from my meeting pics led my choosing one carefully posed to show fiendishly his 1/35th Wermacht weaponry was about to take out Eugenie's multi award wins UFO.

This is a not bad other side look at Alan's Nashorn. I for one really liked how his crew is so active and seeming to be literally in split second freeze but not quite. As much as how his pigment effort turned out far lovelier than his Model Talk would have you believe. Happily here this bonus shot also allows me to show good candid view of Eugenie's finished "Come And Take It" as well. Some of you readers may recall that we have well documented portions of her work here in all its glorious progression, so the final product may be more fully appreciated by us more than most. Her major shift on the overall paint finish from planned color shifting scheme we saw in progress, for instance. Eugenie relayed it was due to persistent clogging performance of color shift paint in her airbrush. Her engineering of the lighting mechanisms turned out spectacularly in my estimate, the batteries had about 30 hours running time with careful management, and that proved perfect for the purposes of the Nationals display!





Truly "a model pair" these two. Eugenie has been extremely superb at absorbing all she can from her husband Randy's years as a modeler and incorporating it into her meteoric modelling ascent. Not to discount the glimpses I have had of how massive her skills at researching, evaluating, experimenting and willingness to tackle, master sufficiently many new things. Inspiring yes

If you think I am being too over the top, just keep in mind she began this only a year ago and it's like her 5th finished model...



Mike Jimenez didn't want to show up empty handed, he said. He borrowed these two beauties from his son's modelling shelf.





Thanks to doing so, Mike's now well apprised of the true identity of these two fairly rarely shown birds, and amused to learn of how this one he thought for sure must be some hypothetical machine, actually was purpose built during World War Two. It's the J7W1 Shinden (Magnificent Lightning), a bold effort at coming up with a sure fire B-29 Killer Interceptor. Likely this kitting a Hasegawa 1/48th edition, and compliments to Mike's son for his modelling it as well as Dad for bringing it to share that night.

The other bird was in fact, more or less a true hypothetical, although it did lead to some post war relatives being made thanks to it's designer, Kurt Tank. If you ever saw the Argentina's first jet, the Pulqui I, this was its predecessor in Luftwaffe terms.

This is the 1/48th scale rendering of Tank's proposed Focke Wulf Ta-183, and it may have been quite a handful if ever built 1/1.



With a great splash so to speak, new Free Hornet **Norm Luebker** showed up "bases covered" for the September club contest, carefully transporting his project 8 years in the making, the 1/350th scale rendering of Solomon Islands base of PT-109, et al.



Norm's introducing himself to us with his 1/350th "Schwerer Gustav" still has me crazed with the wonder of it all, but this work of a piece of history, well words fail me entirely. I can recall he said the palms are etched metal and some of the ships, model figures are commercially sourced. But this entire project came from Norm's imagining, based on photos to create this!

Many of the folks present probably didn't know Ray, but he's been Hornet and Navy for as long as I have known him, many a meet at the Irvington Center or the Hotel? or Scenario Games locales had us getting a great look at Ray's largesse. Ray is especially fond of Skyhawks, Crusaders and Corsair IIs, he served during height of our infamous SEA conflict years and has first hand knowledge of many of these birds in 1 to 1 scale.

I sadly was not able to manage to take notes on much for record here, but I do have it flagged that another Free Hornet Alum sadly no longer with us (David Newman) was partly responsible for why we saw an early F-8C Crusader here from Ray. Dave's Muroc Models conversion set provided Ray the means to getting that end (or rather the nose) for his here, from an F-8E kit.




