



One of two Hetzer 38t light tank destroyers









Another look at the welcomed arrival of this viewing treasure, courtesy of the model artisanship of **Norm Luebkers** in 1/350<sup>th</sup> This is Fort Drum, "The Concrete Battleship" a fortification built in Manila Bay, Phillipines and depicted here as in the 1930s

Norm's fidelity and attention to detail is awesomely rigorous, that is a scale 150 ft depth fully accurate not foreshortened at all.






John covered how the weathering detail was a joy in comparison to the multitude of tiny stencils to apply.

It's being kept under keen observation by a T-34








**Randy Ray** brought in some huge tomes on the Sherman, as you can see

Bob reported their turnout happily exceeded their forecast, and very likely we'll be seeing a 2024 show next fall in Reno ©




Mike Jiminez provided us a grand reveal on why he has been looking for clues how best to paint a rubber figure.

Mike tried out his luck with using "Future" acrylic floor finish on a Hasegawa 1/48<sup>th</sup> P-40C he got from his son's collection






**Chris Bucholtz** moved mightily forward on his latest 1/20<sup>th</sup> scale Prehistoric Production, getting together on an accurate base his extraordinary entelodont ("Hell Pig") Daeodon of the North American plains and hapless prey, three toed horse Parahippus.

Creating a base required more than perhaps meets the eye, as Chris outlined. As he said, a natural tendency is to put rocks and vegetation in symmetrical patterns, which he worked hard to resist, in order to get a "natural look".



Just to assist in giving perspective here, that toothy terror stood at its shoulder 7 feet high and was an "apex" predator in its day.

Chris made it clear that while the resin kit for Daeodon was only two parts, a tail and the amazingly well cast body/head, getting it all to "come alive" was no small trick. Mounting and blending the tail was one bit of challenging fun, but getting the look for the cavernous mouth, enormous canine teeth proved its own epic effort to carry off.






The Contest Director just wanted to have "what might have been "as example for this Special Award in too much fun, honoring this genius of dark comedy & prescient film





# SA4A - Best Cold War



Oh what fun one might have with this one. You could have one particular 4 engined Boeing design that would come in as entrant under all three flags, legitimately, for a start! USN aircraft carrier force was considered as a strategic bomber leg deterrent long before Polaris/Poseidon/Trident fitted SSBNs succeeded them. Plus, within UK & USSR forces: V-bomber trio had two of them that also credibly provide means to compete for SA4B "Cold War Missile" Award, as do some Tu-4, Tu-16, Tu-22, Tu-26, Tu-95 and Tu-160 variants. The USAF B-52 had Hound Dog models along that same path, should you wish to

Again, more to this than perhaps meets the mind's eye on reading. Yes, while SA4 Award series is thematically based on the classic "Mutually Assured Destruction" (MAD) Triad from Cold War, the Missilery component is not limited to "strategic weapons" only. As that would likely be very boring and counter productive for entries.







Realize instead that ALL the Real Space, Civil & Military Rockets/Missiles projects coming from USA/UK & USSR, 1948-91 are also potential entries for the award here.

Ideas? Jupiter, Atlas, Titan, SS-4, Pershing, Blue Steel, Bomarc, Snark, Kitchen, Kennel, Kipper, Davy Crockett, Hound Dog, Red

Top, Sidewinder, Talos, Terrier, Honest John, LaCrosse, Polaris, Poseidon, almost all of them alone available as models over the years. Among shown here are Cold War Classics like S-75 "Guideline SA-2" that infamously shot down two U-2s!

Tri City Fifteen Classic 2023 "Dr. Strangelove"

Again seeking to expand the possibilities beyond a first pass reading that only SSBNs, et al can qualify.

To be clear, ANY Naval subject of USA/UK/USSR between the relevant years is potential. So Soviet Naval forces anti shipping missiles, US/UK/USSR aircraft carriers, figures of personnel, all

manner of anti-sub aircraft, just some good examples. Polaris, Poseidon, Trident missiles, the infamous "Styx" also will work.







Below, the humongous Soviet Typhoon class SSBN, a classic model offering of a Cold War staple, a Red fishing boat outfitted





with enough electronics to operate a city aboard, for a better result in "fishing" near US/UK sea fleets ...





theme that ties directly to movie then. Eerily still to this day, also In Real Life. While movie had splendid, if wicked, plot device that poetically closed curtain on all that went before, no one knew at the time just how on target this idea really was.

In 1964, the Soviet Union began development that lead to a system deployed during the last decades of the Cold War, known as



"Perimeter". System's nickname in Russian translates to "The Dead Hand". Perimeter today is still in place and in working order. As far as anyone knows, luckily this also remains in need of some last human interaction before being set on its automated mission to annihilate with any, all remaining Russian nuclear weapons, basically the rest of the world, in response to a decapitating attack on the former Soviet Union. In 1964, the US Defense Department terminated any plans to proceed further with only known successful nuclear powered ramjet engine, for proposed Mach 3 cruise speed missile called SLAM. Designed to fly over Soviet Union in a pattern for up to 24 hours at 1500 feet while spewing radioactive exhaust, delivering multi KT warheads (payload expected to exceed capacity of multiple SSBNs). *Deemed provocative*.
