With our energetic as ever crew, Model Talk display, Buildfest and of course a super 3 kit Raffle feature of night.




Louis Orselli came through with a great tripoley of prizes for ticket sales, including Third Try for The Sky (master) aka Revell's new C-54D in 1/72.

Mark Schynert had a Special Hobby postwar Messerschmitt, the Hispano HA-1112 Buchon as a WIP, and a nearly finished metal finish/flat red "Mule", the Czech built S,199 postwar Messerschmitt. Nice looking with blown hood, even if "Mule" nickname was a softer rendition of the actual translation for how the real pilots considered the performance of the real airplane, especially handling.




Cliff "Tracker" Kranz was diligently at production of more metal tracks to apply to another of his 1/35 fleet.

The F4U-5NL Corsair of Captain Fernando Soto of the Fuerza Aerea Honduras, credited with three kills in the 1969 "100 Hours War" (aka "Soccer War"). This is recorded as the last piston engine air combat kills in history, and it was a F-51 Mustang, no less! Gabriel's 3 WIP Spacecraft were all from Battlestar Galactica series, all in 1/72. The white one is a Mark 1 Viper, the others I didn't get recorded.







Chris Bucholtz has nearly finished "Mimmi", a late model Fokker D.VIIF, of course in 1/72, using the Roden offering.












Cliff Kranz provided another example of how ancient kit by today's measure (Monogram's SBD is copyright 1959!) will still reward builder with a nice result, given some care.






The new Airfix Dornier Do 17 in 1/72 went to the next ticket drawn (whom I did not record and have forgot by time of this writing).

Now as earlier related, Western Regions of IPMS had 3 shows going on "Triple Threat Saturday", 11/07/15. In Region Ten, the Phoenix-Mesa's IPMS-Phoenix/Craig Hewitt hosted "Modelzona" as they have for several years. 2015 saw them get a reward of biggest show yet, 500+ entries!









As relayed to me by Rodney, this event held in a large hangar of the C.A.F. Museum with a pleasing array of indoor and outdoor exhibit items. Also, because the Commemorative Air Force is "flying museum operation", Warbirds are by design, pretty much providing air shows every day with this event date no exception.

Rodney has been a participant in this contest now for 5 different years, often taking home a number of awards. This year he had a variety on tables again, including a nice "Rutan B-17"

The Table Category signs look awfully "IPMS USA Nats-like"




Which isn't exactly a surprise, as the chapter has been the lead group for more than a couple of USA Nats ... and so extremely appreciated by many!



Lovely work here, a Beech Starship and the "Transformer" Semi








The Skyraider here is a Zoukei-Maru SWS display item in Vendor area. The "skinned" Zero, another competition piece, like Submarines below.





Region 8's IPMS-AVG hosted their 19th Desert Classic on their traditional First Saturday of November. Yes, "Triple Threat Saturday", 11/07/15. In keeping with their own tradition, three Free Hornet Road Warriors showed up, slightly out of sequence, to again enjoy this show. Here's look:

Amazing to this veteran of the AVG Desert Classics, arrived at begin of Judging to discover that this was the only occupant of the aforesaid category!


While the unique signature of "X-Plane" Award is normally a spare number of competitors, a near bare cupboard in 1/72 Jet is extremely rare. I messed up.

Though X-15 turned out as the solo competitor, it wasn't sole "X-craft" present at show. ©

In the pleasingly full classes of Ships, WW 2 British "X-Craft" in large scale was proudly asail.







This Merit kit in 1/35th scale is representative of one of the 6 purpose built X-5 class "special ops" midget submarines which were used in 1943 against German warships in Norway docking. The *Tirpitz* fell victim to two of them, and was out of service until April 1944. Pretty impressive effort, overall.



Another early eye catcher for this photographer was this B-25 Mitchell, which saw a lot of audience stop and look. The 1/72nd Prop category was nearly as scarce as the Jets, which again shocked this Editor. This NMF North American twin definitely carried the day for its class however, a clear winner in finish alone.






The subtle "corrosion/staining" applied to this bird was as impressive as was the overall natural metal application, my pictures don't really do it full justice. Pretty sure this late version WW2 ETO or MTO glass gun nose took home a First here, but I didn't pay enough attention during the awards period to confirm that.

This Tamiya 1/24th Mercedes 300 Gull Wing, is totally Out of Box ...



There was a full category for Rotorcraft, and again this year a Mil product captured the eye of this Editor, demanding to be included in the photoessay

This was the OTHER 1/72nd Prop, deserving a picture at least, made from Airfix F4F-4 with aftermarket "Operation Torch" decals. One thing about Antelope Valley Group for sure: even when there are categories that are underrepresented, the quality of those that show to compete is always consistently high and higher again this year. Tough to beat!

Another consistency, another banner year for the Automotive classes at Desert Classic,



Not often you see so many Rescue and Offroad/Offbeat types, with no "thematic" push.







The 1/48th scale Aircraft and other larger scales Air, on the other hand, were pretty heavy competitions again this year. This on the left, ended up split into THREE categories so that all the worthy contestants got a deserving shot at an award, instead of being edged out by a nit after a grueling process to squeeze the group down to three places...

Antelope Valley Group has some other excellent "signature" features that they have kept, one being "Trifecta" category. 3 entries in one by same builder, must be different in types.



The skills and sheer stamina of a competing modeler will be surely tested here, if anywhere, as you see. This tripoley of USN Aircraft Carrier (Ship), Hot Rod (Auto) and old H-19 (Aircraft) a damn good example of someone who isn't shy in taking on all comers, if you ask me.

Probably see this entrant next time in the "Master's Award" competition, which AVG launched last year as new signature. The F-16 would also be eligible for another long time Special Award of this Desert Classic, namely "The Best Viper", given to finest F-16 Fighting Falcon of the day, except for two small details: This year, it wasn't on offer. That happens from time to time. Also:

The Master's Award is the one category where any and all prior First/Second/Third place win Entry (including of course, past AVG events) can return to compete, against USA/UK National Winners or Region 8 Regional Winners, or just anyone who feels their entry here can "run with the Big Dogs" even if this is the first time they have ever put it on the table! Those who have an entry here, aren't eligible for other awards. Glad someone has guts to try to make this idea work







The Antelope Valley Group offers the opportunity for sponsorships for all their Awards, and several "long time signature features" of theirs are kept in play due to that. The Fremont Hornets have been sponsors in the past for some of these, it was unfortunate for this Editor/Pres/Contest Director of 2015 Hornets that he was unable to make that so for this year's Classic. Incentive to rectify/redouble for #20

This year, the array as you can see above left, offered some pretty wide ranging in Specials. The **Best Auto Paint & Finish**, not one I'd have enjoyed having to final pick, so much to choose from ! **Theme** Award, to be eligible for "Nifty Fifties" as entry, your subject needed to be proven to have at least begun production between 01/01/50 to 12/31/59. So not as easy to qualify as say, merely been "extant then"

Best Russian Armor, Best British Aircraft, pretty self explanatory. good range.

For **Best X-Plane** Award, you need to understand it's only X-1 to X-56 were on the eligible list for this year. Free Hornet Jim Priete has won this FOUR times, we will see whether a future year sees him get "Ace" status with a fifth award. Muroc Models CEO (and alumnus Free Hornet!) David Newman is sponsor of this trophy

New for this year, **First Timer** Award, intended to go to best of the "first ever for being an AVG entrant". **President's** Award, where the AVG President du jour selects their estimate of the Best Model of Show. **TriFecta**, **Masters** awards already covered. So the **Best of Show**, as chosen by the **Judges**, is **self explanatory**.

This English Electric Lightning F.6 in 1/48th scale, is Airfix's exemplary, if somewhat finicky, excellent kitting, built straight out of the box. Considerable effort, a worthy contender for the Best British Aircraft trophy being offered. Contestant noted "decals were slightly out of register", which I didn't notice, until I read it.





While on topic of Out of the Box, here's look over



at most of the entrants in 2015 edition of the class!







There are possibly some of the winning entrants in the three detail closeups I have chosen for showing here, couldn't say for sure. These simply happen to be three chosen by me from my photo set, that were pleasing, very well done examples of the competition in this category.

That Chevy Bel Air definitely in my eye's estimate was in the running for a "Nifty Fifties" and/or Best Auto Paint/Finish, and lovely example of an "Out of the The Box" entrant going the full measure to display entry.

The Yamaha 500 racing machine also well in the casting to me, for the Auto Paint/Finish, Motorcycles are a challenging build and finish subject, in any scale.

The El Camino is just a cool looking machine and especially when in the "finned" period of the marque.

Some more looks at just some of the many Automotive competitors, AVG definitely is a hard place to win and will sharpen up your game by far, even trying out!







Another look is warranted, at the "work truck", really, really good detail and finish work, it also provides another angle on the "Surfer 'Dubya Van", itself every inch a well done classic








1/48th Jet had other lovelies which a smitten Hornet Editor simply has to include for illustration.







The Czech's Aero L-29 Delfin has been a favorite of mine, finding out at AVG there's a grand new quarter scale kit out for her. There in tri-camouflage and open 2 cockpit glory, teases me mercilessly,



I was pleased to see that there was more and quality entries here at AVG for the small scale Armor, since locally for me we're simply not seeing them. Not a trend in the West, just a local anomaly .

One the right, a diorama that simply fascinated the photographer, and you may find it intriguing too. Here is "*Hatari*", in summary:









This entrant really did a marvelous setup here. This wasn't any run of mill piece, and well executed for a fairly obscure (today) movie ref.

The detail work for making these vehicles alone, quite a sweet feat.

The execution as a whole, really a fine demonstration of Dioramics!











The real movie actually had real live captures as part of the making of the film, which certainly would lend "credibility" to production.

Giraffe, rhino are rendered pretty lifelike and seem "alive" in pose.





The positioning of all the human characters is pretty dynamic, another difficult aspect that

creator of the piece seemed to make look easy.









While perhaps not any where near as interesting for some or many of you, the rarity of this kind of diorama alone, plus the genuinely understated brilliant execution of the whole piece which had to be a "labor of love" I had to put this set of pages to record it, for those who will enjoy it and wouldn't have otherwise seen this. 
