

While traveling south to the Antelope Valley Group Desert Classic in Lancaster (via Highway 99) and north to the OHMS Contest/Show up in McMinnville, Oregon via Highway 5 this year, happened upon these hitherto unknown to him, roadside subjects. Have a look for yourself now.

off "99". Mike Meek clued me that this was an oddity, a fairly rare FireBomber A-26, being of Canadian registry. No clue how this Invader found a



home here, though appeared to be under a "repair or inspection" status. Parked in a large open space, alone, sits C-FAGO. Sign shot above? My one reference to her locale, on fence opposite of the A-26









Ever since we first met, so long ago, have I been so captivated by these aggressive, attractive lines.

In fact, the very first photos I'd take in my life involved a (then) small rural airport, pair of A-26 FireBombers, off in a corner. Of course they were Polaroids, that I managed somehow keep track of, until recently. It was Medford Airport, Oregon, late 1960s and I fell for her hard. Madly struck by Ed Heinemann's purposeful and powerful Douglas Attack design. Repeated again here, c'est la vie.

Then, another curiousity encountered as we three departed site of discovery for the "yellow Invader" I had espied from the Highway. Minter Field's



Air Museum was closed at the time, but I could see through the fencing that there were exhibits to check. Finding this Aermacchi MB-326 was a shock! Again, no clue hitherto of this museum or this bird's existence, quite fun.






The faded and worn condition notwithstanding, there was an "N" civil registration to indicate this jet trainer had been a US Civilian at some point.



My Comments on Judging at the 2013 IPMS/USA Contest

I – AIRCRAFT

139 PROPELLER DRIVEN

1:32 SCALE SPLIT (?)

INLINE ENGINES



I was one of three judges, including one lady "OJT" person. OJT is defined as: On The Job Training. We judged the above stated category.

One of the other team judges was appointed by the Head Aircraft Judge, Mr Bill Devins to be our "team leader". Our team leader elected to write on the back of each entry form what was wrong with each model (eg: dust, seams, gaps, alignment etc.). When we were finished judging this category we turned over the entry forms and counted up the flaws. This gave us the selection of three models that had the fewer amount of imperfections. Thus our team leader CAREFULLY picked up each model and we all looked on the bottom of the model(s). The team leader had on a rubber glove, so he did not leave any residue on the models. He did not break any models. Shown below are the three winning models that we all agreed upon, including our "OJT" judge, who does not vote. However, we felt that she was a great help to us so we ask for her comments. (from L-R, 1st, 2nd, 3rd Place)









If your model was not in the winning circle then it contained more flaws than the three winners. If you did not pick up your entry form with your model, then you will never know why your model did not win.

The losing models had several of the basic flaws: Gaps, Sink/Mold Marks, Bad Seams, Wing, Tail-Plane, Canopy and Landing Gear Alignment, Decal Silvering and Paint Problems.





Dust on models from the "home front" was a problem and we discounted any dust from the carpeted convention hall floor.











If you become an "OJT" like I did back in 1987, you will learn how to build a winning model. Some of the helicopters that we judged in another category appeared to have a large accumulation of household dust on their models, which could not be blown off.

Suggestion to all modelers: Please deep clean your models prior to bringing them to ANY CONTEST. From the time I finish my models, take their photos, they go to my dust proof showcase and/or in a dust proof plastic box. Three decades ago my finished models were placed on shelf in our living room or on a shelf in my model room. Within just a couple of months, they were covered with kitchen grease and then dust settled on them.


I tried wiping off the "goo" and ruined most all of my then 27 models. Today, I have models in my showcase that were built in the late 1980's on into the 1990's. They still look as if I finished them yesterday plus they are dust-free. Cheers and have more modeling fun.



This year's "Big Bore Bash" weekend had another bumper crop of sweet vintage British, Japanese, American speed machines, all easily accessible as you see.



Responding to query of talk that Korean investors had offered him recently 50 million dollars for ownership of WSIR:

In Bill's own words, at age 90 ... "Fifty million is a lot of goddamn money, but when you think about it, what could I do that's like this? I made two \$45,000 scores on two different deals once. I've had a lot of money, but the money never meant much, really. And when you're older, what are you going to do, spend it? On what?" Thanks for that one, kind Sir. Mr. Huth passed less than a year later, May 4, 2015. Requiescat In Pace, good man.
