My 2016 Opening Comments For Promoting This Fall's Hornet's TC-12

Our TriCity Classic has a now fairly long run tradition whereupon the titled theme being combine of a known movie linked directly to specific geography. 2016's use then of "*The Battle of Britain*" would be obvious, no? A title which pretty much says our contest has a "British or British related" theme. Not intended as limiter!

Of course ANY and ALL MODEL SUBJECTS are encouraged, welcomed to enter.

A Contest Theme is a way to have some fun, give an overall tone for our show from one year to the next. PLEASE FEEL FREE to ignore entirely, or plunge headlong into the fray, as you see fit. Just see fit to enter show and enjoy yourself, is all this Contest Director here wishes for. This year, he's trying a supplementary approach.

Below, find the current list of the planned for TC-12 Special Awards, by award # and title. Some details for each directly noted.

As some of these are pretty self explanatory (SA13 through SA17, the Best in Category Awards) Contest Director won't keep them in this series of essays in the months ahead. Best of Show Awards (SA1, SA2) would seem also to fit as "self identified". Others won't likely need much re-iteration or expansive explanation for garnering turnout or giving a clue what the Judges are going to be looking at/for (SA6, SA7, SA8), but this Editor will include a brief in the upcoming effort. Several left, which will get some extra emphasis to promote, just to try something besides the "Specials Reference PDF" which has been again written. For first portion, Director will cover more on three possibly less well communicated Specials, awards SA 11, SA 12 & SA18.

SA 11" Lightning Strikes Twice"

Award for

the Best Twin Engine Lightning







While not specifically linked to overall theme for TriCity Twelve, richly embroidered in potentials for "wily game lawyering" Perhaps restrictive by designating "twin engine" as part of the eligibility, note one could delve deep, determine something that fits this description that Director overlooked, give it a double shot. For now, the simplest outlining of what is eligible, this: **ANY SCALE** and **ANY VERSION of these listed AIRCRAFT:**

English Electric Lightning, Lockheed Aircraft Lightning, Arado AR-234 "Blitz" (Lightning in German)

Take careful note, these are all "Twin Engined" designs at their outset, and all officially "Lightning" by name



As long as your subject entry(ies) fit inside that outline, you're good to go. Any other effort, will be judged as dicey at best. So ANY number of subjects is eligible to start with. They don't have to be British, clearly. However, one may consider the fact that *all three indeed did* at some point, *legitimately wear RAF markings* during their useful lives. Be sure to consider how this

could be a rather larger range than first meets the eye for potential and still be eligible by the rules, subjects.

Also keep in mind, while there is a "no sweeps in Special Awards" proviso in place for TriCity Twelve, this particular award does offer an opportunity to the intrepid for a twin or better chance at a single entry being eligible for more than this, conceivably.

As FURTHER INCENTIVE, consider "Straight Wing Jet" arched glass award here from TC-11 shown above, is serving as sample of likely TC-12 trophy type for this Special Award. Go for it!





SA 12 "Mightiest Merlin"

Award for

Best Merlin Engined Air , Land or Sea Subject

Rolls Royce and this particular engine are practically synonymous.

So what more British subject could one have, besides James Bond, 007 (whom of course for one, is FICTIONAL, and for whom model basis in quantity/quality is lacking)? Part of catalyst for this award.



Without a doubt, first and foremost forecast is that anyone will picture this as merely another sea of Spitfires and Mustangs, never a bad thing really. Yet, as a Contest Director, you'd probably like to provide some means to expand the potential customer base to at least convince yourself if not them, that there's more to this than that. Clearly here, you have way more priming & promotion for improving the conception to your potential customers!

For those who don't know or realize: among Merlin employments in strictly British terms, you have Fairey Battle, Hawker Hurricane, DH Mosquito, DH Hornet, BP Defiant, HP Halifax, Avro Lancaster, besides well known Spitfire. Of course, that's not an exhaustive list of Brit Birds with Merlins. Merely the more commonly seen and available to scale model. Then there's the Land and Sea applications of this famous engine family, which will

be more emphasized here for our contesting

So ANY Merlin engined Air, Land or Sea based vehicle is eligible. Consider "Meteor" engines by Rolls Royce are treated simply as being Merlins under a different name. Being they were in their lifetime considered as "land based" versions of famous aircraft motor. There were also modifications of the basic engine to permit their application and



usage in RAF AirSea Rescue Launches, MTBs, Motor Gun Boats. Post war, unlimited Hydroplane racing boats had a very successful run of different vehicles that employed formerly airborne Merlins in "marine usage". Don't forget also, movie "Battle of Britain" employed for "He-111" bombers;

Spanish built CASA 2111, MERLIN Powered. As well as those '-109s that were Hispano Suiza Ha-1112s, also

Merlin engined.

Even a "Beast" of an auto that actually saw asphalt and success as an enthusiast vehicle.

As more incentive, consider TC-11 "Straight Wing Jet" arched glass award shown at right is serving as sample of likely TC-12 trophy type for this Special. *Make with the Mighty Merlin MayhemModelling!*
