



Or maybe, just maybe, he awaited return of Mr White


As Grand Conspiracist & Notorious Net Surfer Ray Lloyd held confrere with dangerous "Tamiya Long" and innocent Frank B, they

2016 show opening in a few hours from this display period, Jim Priete's rendition of the Mark Donohue 1970 Trans Am AMC Javelin. Celebration of all things "Trans Am" (in both Racing and Pontiac Firebird terms) would definitely bring a spotlight to this work of his, even in the unfinished state.

In any case, this extremely rare Jo-Han automotive kit has been in Jim's workshop for a while, and looks like another checkered flag when he deigns to finish her.





Joining the Javelin, was Jim's recently completed "mild conversion" of the Academy 1/72 scale kit for Lockheed Ventura PV-1 Patrol Bomber. Nice

Jim's Ventura is a PV-1N, Night Fighter in the WW2 PTO, meaning a small radar has been outfitted to the nose. It equipped the first ever USMC Night Fighter squadron VMF(N)-531, achieving first kill (a G4M Betty) November 13, 1943 whilst patrolling the Solomon Islands in South Pacific.





Next up was more of "Mr Kranz's Panzer Neighbourhood" which you can see, is a somewhat contentious lot, brandishing barrels at every turn it appears.












Unfortunately, Editor didn't get a bit of details this time out, any information for which kits, what Cliff did to each of the three here will have to come from asking at a later meeting.



As our RC, one of our lawyers confer on this matter, Steve Ng neatly






shields any view of Ray Lloyd's "secret screen pages" from prying eyes. When I go to ask RC Chris, he's now shed his jacket and along with Randy,

Usually tight lipped Mike Woolson's working further on a World Rally Car project, and continues his notable aptness


at secret keeping as well.






INDEED, it is POLITICS NOT AS USUAL. Thanks, Ray, for livening it up.



This year's main theme was "Trans Am" which let Pontiac Firebirds be a possible feature along with the racing tradition


The "sub theme" was a Favorite, "Rat Rods"
