



That P-38L in overall black with the tail stripes, grabs attention, as clearly does Cessna twin jet with a "bat plane" motif underside !


Didn't get the details I am sorry, on what decal sheet, colors were on this A-37, which appears to be a pale blue/pinkish white camo.

So Cliff swapped out that one for an older, "box scale" which was Monogram '50s issue kit. Seems pretty blended, even if



not "strictly 1/144<sup>th</sup>" scale throughout, definitely every inch a Connie atop Shuttle Booster rockets

Another surprise on the table was this FR 5 Firefly, in  $1/72^{nd}$ .

Give yourself a look at the model on a stick which is what Dave Parks was here sharing view with Kevin.










Being that no notes were taken, Editor will be unable at this point writing be quickly able to pin down what Wermacht 212 is. Oh, wait, there's INTERNET







Previous Sunday, September 26, was the TriCity 12 "Battle of Britain" Classic, as fortune would have it, several Muddlers made the trip North to be part of the show

Besides leaving behind the 2016 John McLane award for Best 1/48 WW2 A/C, now in the care of Jack Riggar of Santa Rosa, winner for his Kittyhawk IV, they had one member in his haste to get car pool underway, leave behind a lovely F-1 model ! Fortunately, Rich Pedro came to the rescue, kept it safe for return swiftly.







While I knew who's car model it was at the show, having pleasure of knowing Mr Tom Leutzinger, meeting him at many local and even National IPMS events over the years, I had no easy way to get his model safely back from event. Richard was the hero here.

We worked on plan to transit to Monterey for meeting and lo here we go!

Why, here as we arrive just in time, is Tom in the window!

As you may see already, there's models on display in the well lit areas that are meeting locale boundaries, well named "Solarium Conference Room". We were very quickly made to feel very welcome and got into mixing here

When we were in Model Talk, as it turned out, we started with Oliver's Work in Process here, an M2A2 in  $1/35^{\text{th}}$ .

Oliver patiently posed for me to shoot while he shared his experiences so far with this Academy IFV. Still fun, yes!







Here she is, John Player Special Lotus Formula One racer, 1978 in 1/12<sup>th</sup> scale. Taking third in Category 27, Open Wheel Competition Auto at TC-12. Tom does other models besides racing automotive, I know in fact he did a pretty competitive modern USN Carrier not too many years back. He also places in Unfinished category from time to time, glad he braves where others seem to fear to tread.

Tom's pretty fearless in other ways, too. During another portion of the meeting, I had a chance to extol and promote Orange Con to the MBay Muddlers, whom I learned, had not ever experienced this fine show much further South, in the fall. As I lamented that this year I'd be unable to fit it into my schedule, in part not having a car to even be meeting up with others to road trip, Tom asked me right off if I'd go still, had I a traveling partner to share expenses and vehicle. He'd been invigorated by my description of past OrangeCons I'd been to,

plus noted my enjoyment of how several of their members, like the Muddlers I know, were often over the years to be found at shows like OR McMinnville, Reno, Fresno, SVC, TriCity (they even did both Oregon and Fremont this year!). Although we took a shot at going, my other half torpedoed any chance of my bugging out on already scheduled plans for that following Saturday, so Tom and I didn't end up trying this trip out.

Perhaps on prior page, you noticed in photo how David Conneau seemed to be casting a spell in front of Tom Leutzinger. Below, is what came out





David had this beautiful layed out display for his recently done 1/48<sup>th</sup> P-38 USAAF Lightning. Those vintage advertising repro from the same period, really set it off, I think. Richard talked to David at much more length on this model than did I, so you'll have to ask him for detail.

I enjoyed utterly, Eric H's story of this Millenium Falcon in  $1/144^{\text{th}}$  by Bandai here, as there is a poetic punch line to all the effort that went into his model.

Having a woman friend who's a huge Star Wars fan, he'd had idea to make her this vehicle as a gift. This is a rear angle view, you'll see much more ahead, as I was just enchanted with this.









As you look upper left, just imagine David as he points out, "can't you just see the B-29 in there?", while Eric was giving us the excellent full story of how this model of a model came to pass and what fun he actually had, despite all the agony of detail.

The figures, even as small as they are, really have a life of their own. Serious, Eric, this is great stuff

This is truly a labor of love, friendship triumphs over all else, for he finished with the fact here's a model that very soon would be leaving, never to be seen at a contest or by its builder likely much again, as he was to deliver it very soon after.

After Ramon Lomeli was done explaining to us all that was his


motivation for choosing this new wave model kit, I was ready myself to place an order !

Ramon was also very very good in his presentation of his 1/48<sup>th</sup> scale CH-47 here, too










Other clubs may have more kids in families who have a family member as a modeler. But M-Bay has more *active youth modelers* as part of their core in my measure, than any other club in R-9.


