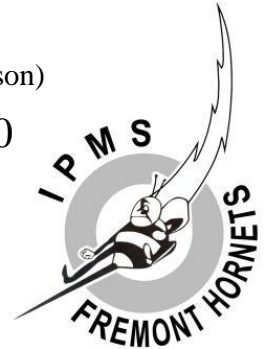

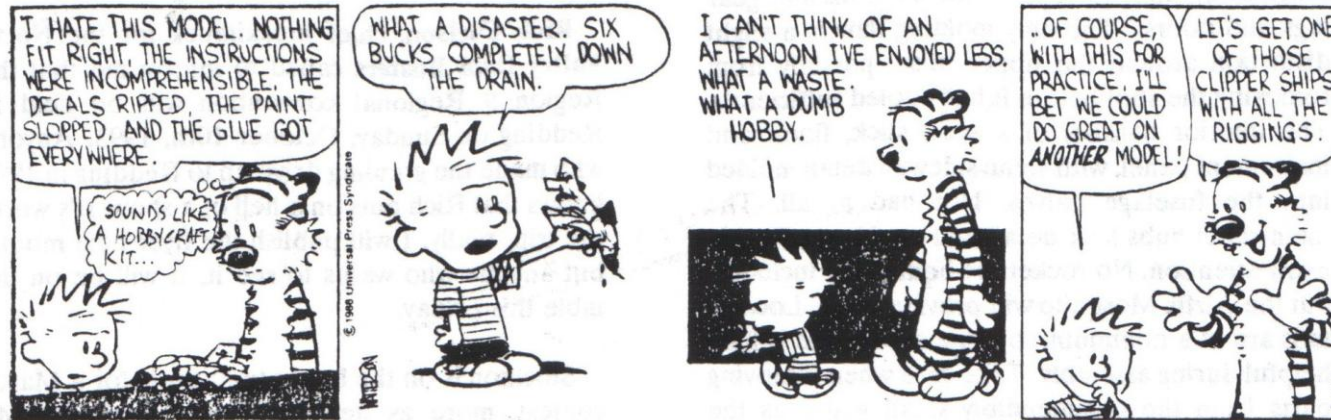

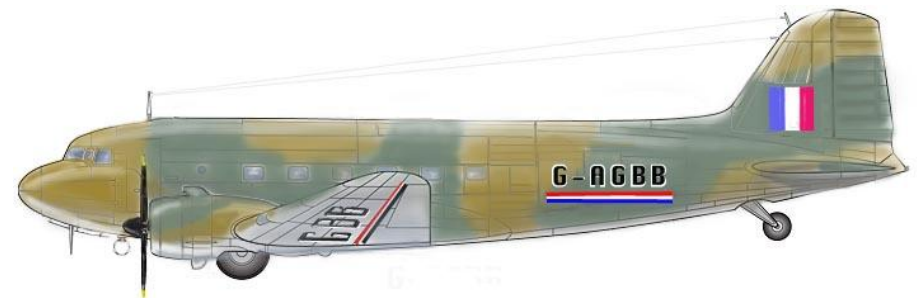

HASEGAWA's 1/72nd Scale J-35 DRAKEN

First off I'm just going to say it: this kit isn't worth the \$25-30 that people are charging for it now. It's kind of a rarer model, though having been reboxed several times (with new decals each time) and even once by Revell Germany. It's recently been re-released with special Ace Combat Espada Squadron markings (which only bumps up the price).

Either way, I found the price hard to swallow, but eventually gave in and picked one up for \$30.

The reason why I say the kit isn't worth this price is the parts count. It's got just 64 parts on four runners, and that's it. The plastic really doesn't take up much room in the box at all. That aside, the kit is like any other Hasegawa 1/72 airplane - good fit, finely engraved panel lines, decals for instrument panels, and actually requiring more filler than I'd care to admit.



I'm not at all saying this is a bad kit- don't get me wrong. But it definitely leaves some to be desired. It's been almost a decade since this kit's release and even with all its imperfections (limited in terms of variants due to canopy shape, the awful gap between the exhaust section and fuselage), it's still the best 1/72 Draken available. Oh well. Neither here nor there.

From the outset, I planned to model this aircraft as Shin Kazama's fighter from the manga series Area 88. Although Area 88 is animated in two iterations (both as an OVA and as a TV anime), the Draken has never had this privilege.

Thankfully, both Hasegawa and Platz have released kits of Kazama's Draken in the past, providing color diagrams to accurately show the markings and paint scheme of this particular aircraft.



“ Draken ” in Swedish translates to “ Kite ”

I used both kit decals (for the stencils and other markings) and markings from Hasegawa's old 1/72 Area 88 F-20 Tigershark (courtesy of my friend Kyle) to finish this model.

The camouflage was freehanded- the light color is a mixture of Tamiya Acrylic XF15 Flat Flesh and XF60 Dark Yellow, while the darker color is XF51 Khaki Drab mixed with a couple drops of XF2 Flat White.

The metal underside of the aircraft is painted using Tamiya AS-12 Bare Metal Silver from a spray can, and certain panels are darkened using X-19 Smoke from an airbrush.

Underside portions not in a natural metal finish are XF-23 Light Blue. A combination of pre-shading and Tamiya Panel Line Accent give the paintwork depth, and the model is sealed in Testors' Lacquer Dullcote.

Polishing canopies is 1000% worth it



Although it isn't perfect (one of the missile racks is crooked and there's some silvering present on a couple stencils), I'm pretty happy with these results.



Micro Sol made the tail decal behave like it very well should

Will I buy another Draken to finish in real-world markings? Probably not. But hey: I did say that I wasn't going to buy anymore models this August, and ended the month with a fat stack of Curtiss fighters, so who knows what my wallet has in store for me?

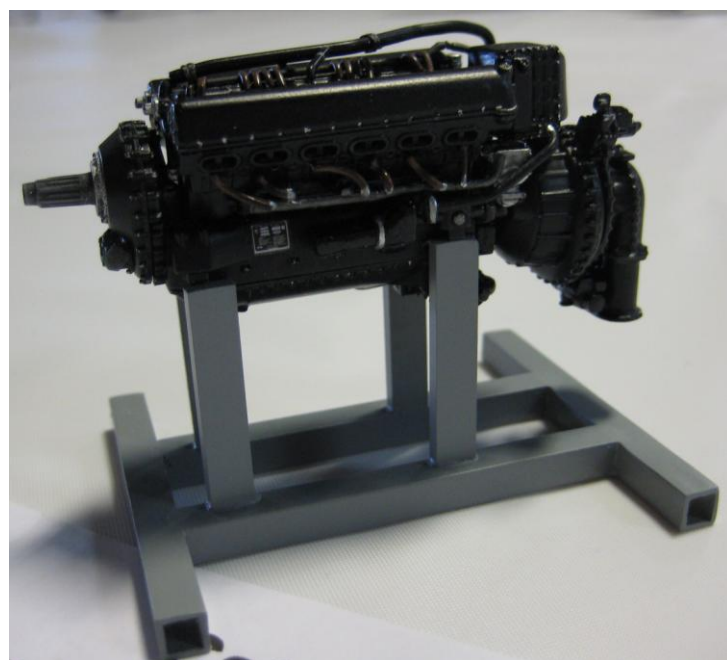
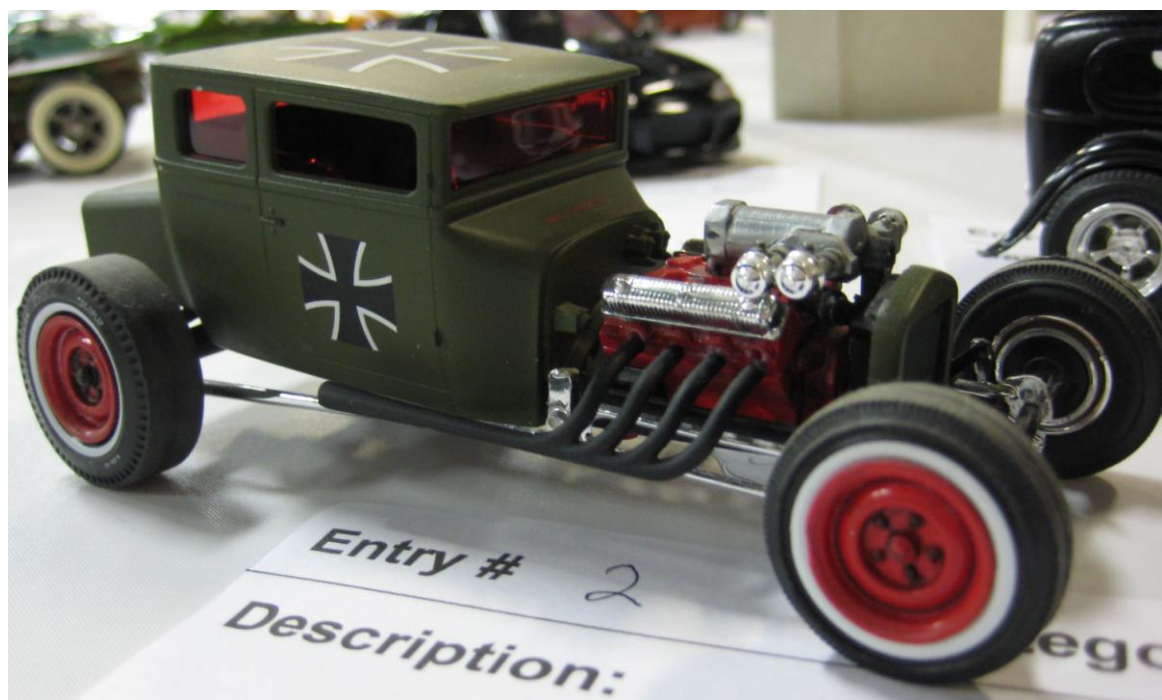
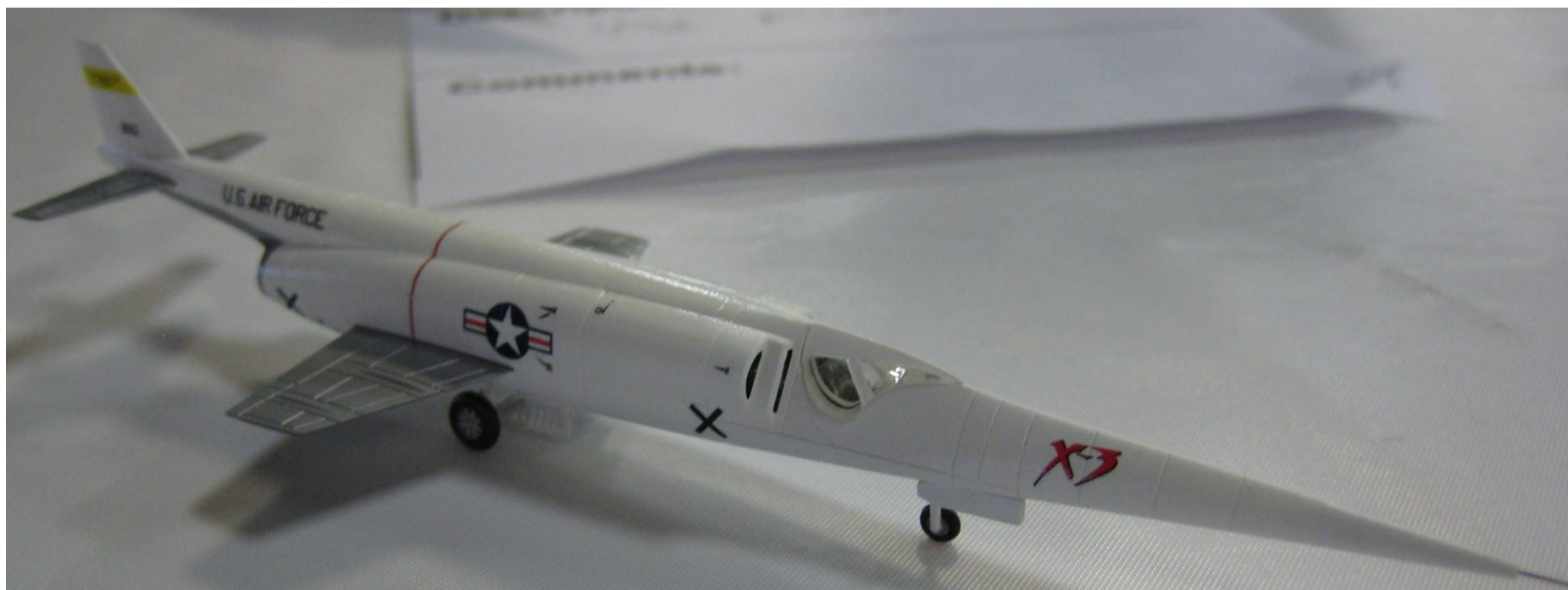

RECAP : Sometime during the year of 2006 I found a 72nd scale “Italeri” model kit of a “F-5E” which is a U.S.A. single seat fighter jet that was all painted up in what looked like a Bengal Tiger’s stripes.

This model caught my eye and like Ron Eminger told me back in the mid 1980’s: “Rodney, if you want to catch the attention of other modelers at a contest then build a colorful model.” I followed Ron’s advice and bought the kit, then built it later that year. In 2007, I found four more “ Tiger-Meet ” models that were for sale by one of the model manufacturing companies that were on the web so I just up and bought all four kits . Kits are as follows: 1. F-104G with German markings of 24 + 19 . 2. CF-104 with Canadian markings . 3. F-104 with “ 999 ” markings 4. TF-104G Italian Special . The kit instruction for all 4 of these Hasegawa kits just tell the same information concerning the fighter and how many “NATO” countries bought these different aircraft and said nothing about why they were painted up in these fancy colors. The TF-104G aircraft was fashioned with two seats while the CF version looked just like the regular F-104 Starfighter.

Alas, in 2009 I found 4 more F-104 Starfighters all painted up in “Tiger Meet” colors and you guessed it: I just had to buy and build them. One of the “F-104S” kits had a very nice Tiger head painted on both side of the fuselage, which was located just aft of the cockpit. Another “F-104S” had a big Tiger head facing the viewer on a bare-metal background. It has “The Last Starfighter” on both droptanks. Next, an F-104 fashioned after race pilot Darryl Greenamyer’s “Red Baron.” By this time it was very easy to build another F-104 because I knew all the good and bad aspects of the kits. My last Hasegawa kit, a TF-104G Starfighter. Painted a nice looking light blue color, had a name of “ Boelcke Special ” painted on aft fuselage. The model went together real easy and it was the last “Tiger Meet” model in my collection. *(end of abridged recap)*

NOW WE CONCLUDE WITH PART FOUR , AS RODNEY FINDS NEED TO BUILD ONE MORE

I was all done building F-104 Starfighter models.



Until I see a bare metal model available in the Japanese “JASDF” markings, and you know by now that I had to have that model in my collection. It’s not a “Tiger-Meet” model but I have enclosed a few images of it. Enjoy

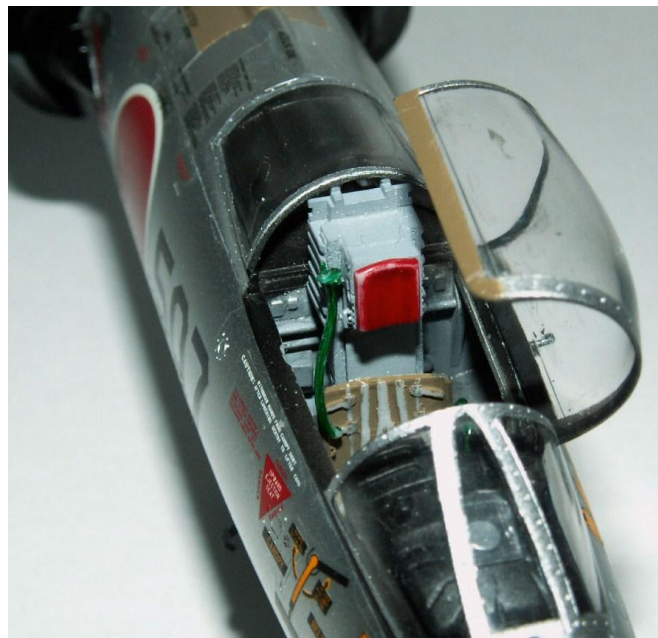
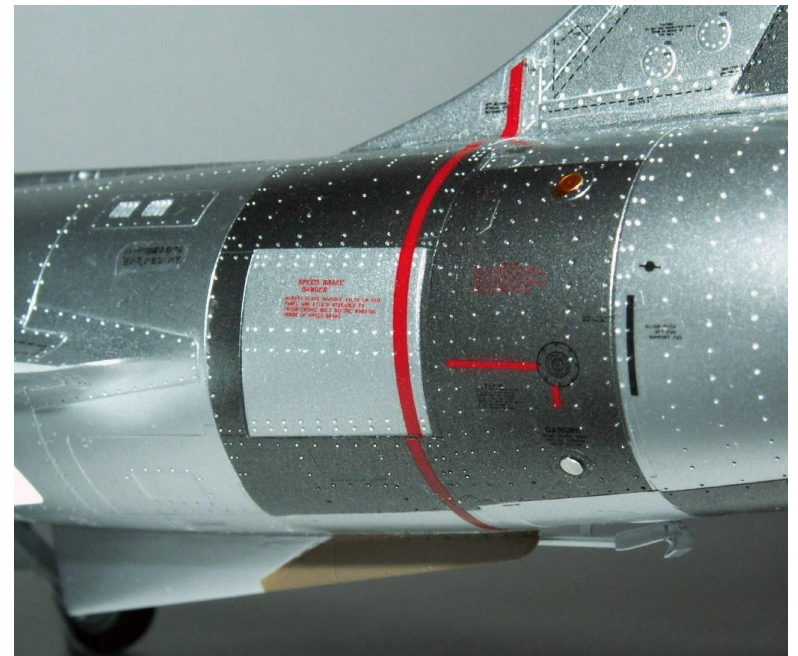

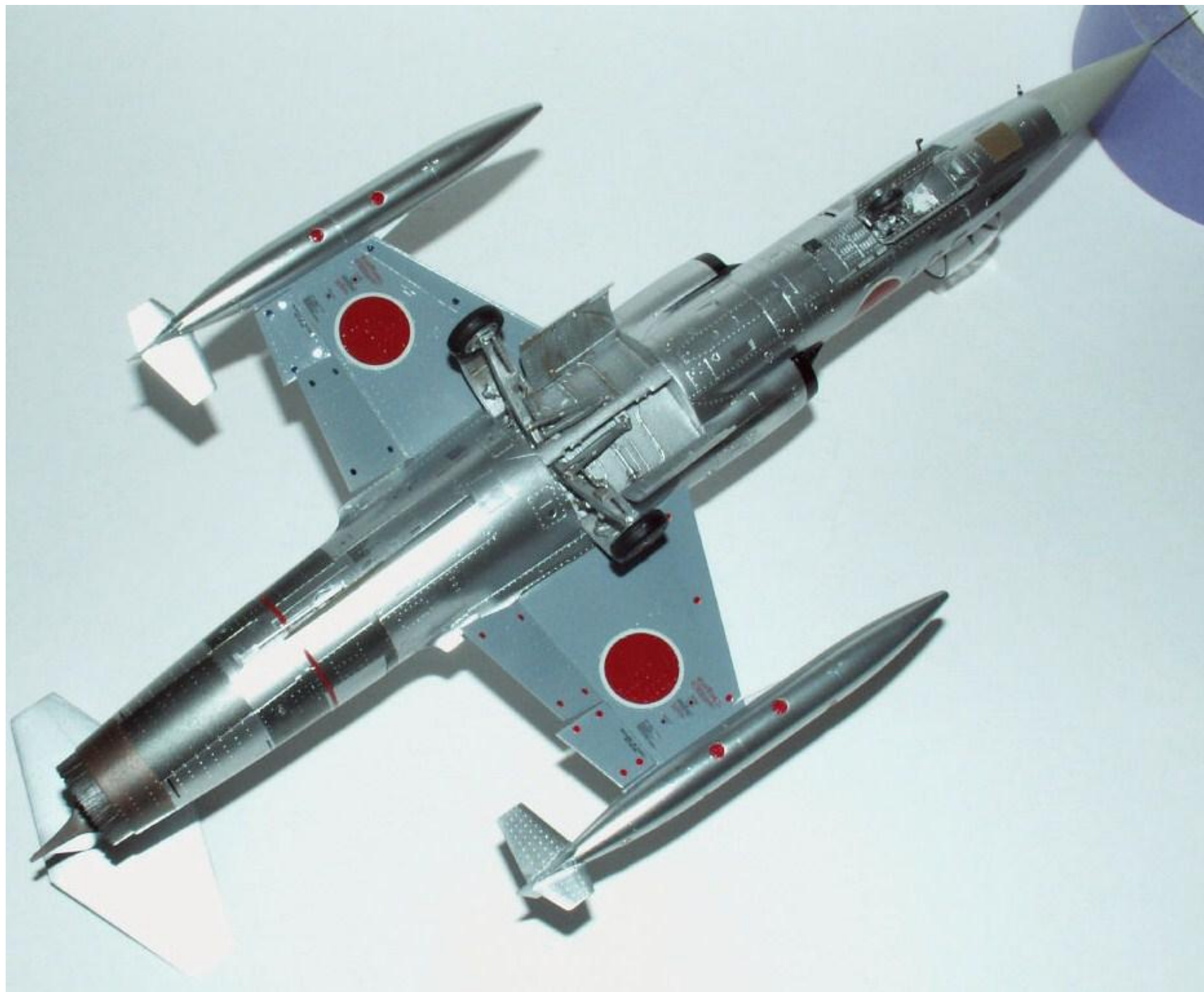
