

Burton opened the meeting after being "gaveled in" by Jim Priete, and welcomed all to the "40th Year of Fremont Hornets", which it is, even when some wanted to "strictly interpret" as not being so in January. Since President is also the Editor, he calmly pointed out as was already published in Buzz #57, the club's formation started in Fall of 1976, and while first meeting wasn't until March, club was in operation as a group by January 1977. Details & quibbles, BAU.

A quick review of upcoming events, namely opening one of NNL West 2017 at end of January, followed by Region 9 first 2017 show Hosted by Silver Wings of Sacto in February, then SVSM's March 4th SV Classic...then nothing until September. Feast or famine ⁽²⁾ Model Talk opened with Cliff Kranz's collection, but first a look below left of Cliff's WIP. Namely a 1/35th "Raumer S".





Cliff's group of 7 included this 1/35th Tamiya Gama Goat in a scheme not out of the box. Namely because Cliff made it one very personal to him.

Cliff had on table a pair of Polaroids from January '69 which were of one of earliest GAMA Goats in USA.





This "articulated truck" was a design from the firm Chance Vought, later known as LTV. Best known to many as the maker of two very deservedly famous, lauded US Navy birds, that's right, this "Goat" was from the home of the "MiG Master" F-8 Crusader and A-7 Corsair II.

Cliff was in the service of the US Army and at a Texas base awaiting orders when he had presence of mind to take snapshots of this odd looking vehicle. He made small mods to his Tamiya kitting in order to better replicate this very early configuration, as model based on later productions. Quite an intersection of history, personal life and modeling, no ?







Next with personal attach for Cliff was this UNIMOG 435, he saw them while in Germany as again a guest of the USG, in the Army. This is a more modern model, ambulance in camo.



While on the subject of German equipment, this particular vehicle definitely was not one Cliff would have encountered, as it was originated in 1934. His model is of one from Spanish Civil War in service with Franco's Nationalist Air Force. It is a 1/72nd scale Arado Ar-68, one of the first "modern" fighters in Luftwaffe service as result of Germany's repudiation of Versailles Treaty



Cliff is seeking another of these Huma models, a pretty rare item however.

He'd like to do radial engined version, he said.


Next up, a Huma kit too!






Not to be neglectful, as a postwar treat, Cliff's Czech version of Arado Ar-96B, the Letov C2B in vintage 1948 scheme.

A KP 1/72nd scale kit, of course (a Czech model)











While this configuration may have caused Jack Northrop to exit this plane of existence early, had he ever seen what Cliff crafted, this " trimotor twin" Black Widow kitbash a signature modeling work of Mr Kranz's. It's in 1/72nd.

Cliff did give indication of the identity of this modern period Combat Engineering Vehicle in 1/35th, but as happens, President/Editor didn't get it written down and now cannot detail it for you readers...



Beginning with two innocent Airfix P-61A kits, Cliff engineered a method to credibly fit them as you see here. Pretty elegant, eh?

He used two different existing schemes on a Microscale aftermarket decal to adorn the noses and provide his serial number.

Not claiming any designation for this, may concoct one if one likes. The number series in reality for "P" (for Pursuit) basically was



no further than 89 (for another Northrop, the Scorpion) before the "F" (for Fighter) replaced it with US Air Force creation in 1948. However, when a "fantastic craft" is made, you clearly have all the "alternate history licence" at your behest. So P-132 Black Widow II could easily be made case for.



After all, the P-61 Black Widow was basis, and it is a "two into one" craft, no?



Now before we move on to others work on the January Model Talk table, must be fair and balanced here, not leave completely cryptic what my "signature" bit regarding Cliff's crafting means to those who don't know him well enough.

I have seen him turn up at events and meetings over the years with a 1/28th scale "Triple Fokker Triplane" for one, yes a seamlessly blended Dr.I with of course three "rotary" engines, one can only imagine the torque issues !

Far from his only other "tripoley" effort, he has also carefully melded three Ford Trimotors in 1/77th scale, yes, that corrugated aluminum beastie. There is at least one other project but my memory fails in recall. Still, you get gist.



Now, in effort to remind readers where we began since we now take leave of Cliff's collection to complete account of January Modeltalk

Here is "the opposite look across" photo arrangement. Right below, a closeup "opposite look" at Bob Meyers' Tamiya JSU-152, which he praised as pretty damned nice "out of the box" with fixtures supplied to properly sag the plastic tracks, etc. Bob did replace kit barrel with one aftermarket metal one, however he said the plastic one was pretty nice. The weathering on this construction of a Berlin'45 schemed vehicle, well my pictures here don't completely do it justice. Damned nice.



Next door to Bob's Soviet, was a pair of Tamiya tanks, one from WW2 Germany and one Soviet that's not, still kind of fun in the coinciding...

In this shot on left, you can compare relative sizes of all three rather well, and relates to a comment by the builder of the "boxed" two about really big the two WW2 machines are in compare to the "modern" one.

Builder being our dual passporter, "Cuban" Ben Pada and the two, his WW2 Panther and the postwar Russian T-55 MBT (smaller than either) Ben is providing great example results in trying an excellent technique for "model improvement", he's doing subject "out of his comfort zone"








One other who showed how he was splendidly having fun outside his "comfort zone", returned us to "Tripoley" in one instance.


This 1/72nd Roden molding of Fokker Dr 1 Triplane, is from a "bagged kit" which David Parks got at an event.

LOOKING BACK AT FORTY – Hornets Ramped Up Fast & Furious




Yes, 2017 marks the 40th year for charter of IPMS/Fremont Chapter of Region Nine of the International Plastic Modeler's Society, USA aka "The Fremont Hornets" or as President/Editor likes to refer to us, "Free Hornets ". While this Editor hasn't been a member for the entire span, he has been lucky enough to be friends with some who have, and known several of the Hornets who will be part of this upcoming series on our history.

Thanks again to Mr Cliff "Trucker" Kranz here (in June '77 b&w shot) who came with his offer to loan his personal archives to me, at Christmas 2015 Hornets. Cliff made sure I knew he had me "backup plus" club(s) history material ready when I was.

I say "club(s)" here because Cliff had just that: Very complete documentation for the Free Hornets, along interesting pieces here and there over the years to enlighten or expand my own knowledge of Region 9 and related model community beyond. *Grazi* !

Nowadays, seems that having a "voice activated digital recorder" is nearly a necessity, because now being recently retired, Cliff's even more relaxed and easily triggered to recall much "living history" of our community in a manner best captured "as he tells it". Alas, you'll simply have to get him in a conversation yourself, as I try to weave my own material, his and others best I can, here.

FOR OUR SECOND INSTALLMENT: We pick up where we left off, having just learned the Original IPMS Fremont Logo was the work of none other than one long time Region Niner, Mr. Jack Riggar, and first seen on the newly named "FREMONT FREEBEE" Newsletter, Vol 1 No. 3 (yet now actually the FIFTH published pamphlet by freshman chapter of IPMS/Fremont. So see, The Buzz V.1 "off by 1" numbering of mine is "norm")



IPMS/Fremont - Sept. '77 Newsletter Vol. 1 No. 3

SEPTEMBER '77

Club looking pretty Big Time already, as efforts by Mal, Jack show on Header here. At this time, not really practical for this Editor to make "consistent/readable" Digital Archive copies of these newsletters, so you'll just have to bear with my narrative style accompanied by selected clips as we proceed. Sometimes I will summarize portions or highlight a particular segment, in supplement or instead of showing all of a specific Newsletter in this series. But I am currently set up for intent of pretty comprehensive history from origins 1977 on until early 90's. Basically after 1995, there ceased to be documentation of Hornets...until TC-1

TC-1 (*TriCity Classic One*) came about *May 22, 2004.* It was of course preceded by flyers and other documented efforts, during Editor's first term of office as President of the Free Hornets. He was lucky enough to be at Chapter Helm when Mark Schynert & host of others came up with, carried forth with this splendid return of Hornets Club to the Region Nine competition community. President's one major contribution was to say yes to it. But I digress, merely trying to give a framework and plot summary to this "Machinery of Memories Time" and provide catalyst for contributions...

RETURNING NOW TO September 1977 – We find the "Aircraft/Armor" program already in full swing, that is to say the Club Officers had come up with this procedure to make "Primarily Aircraft" then "Primarily Armor" the theme for monthly meetings of IPMS Fremont, with assurance of course that ALL MODELS ARE WELCOMED. Here's a direct statement of the upcoming "Aircraft" schema for September '77 meeting, exciting!

September Meeting:

We have a big September AIRCRAFT theme meeting planned. Our guest will be former P51 pilot in WW2, Roy Raymond, of Fremont. We hope to have a radio controlled model of his P51 to show, and we have a movie of the RC P51 in flight. Mr. Raymond will be there with some very interesting items he has saved over the years. He will also try and answer questions you might have about the P51 and his experiences in it as a fighter pilot in Italy. Hopefully there will be several plastic "CHECKER-TAIL" Mustangs on hand, too.

For our special raffle deal, bring European Theatre WW2 aircraft. We will give two free-ticket: if its a 15th Air Force CHECKERTAIL and one for any other ETO aircraft, Allied or Axis. Only one deal per customer.
