

Seems that this year's Silvercon had its own moment in the sun on that score. The range of history and types of auto models in competition, scale rivalled museum!





























The American Classics

This is a 1:48th scale Sopwith Schneider by Special Hobby, which has undergone conversion to the single seat Sopwith Baby scout/recon/fighter. It was used as an "Anti-Zeppelin" solution to some success. This particular schemed aircraft served on the World War One Palestinian Front







Looking across tables found no lack of aircraft model entries in several categories. Above, Free Hornet Gabriel Lee dominated in 1/72 Jet with FIVE single engine jets as you see above. He ended up rewarded, too!

T-55 in Middle Eastern national service. Then some award shots








Somewhat hidden yet you can still be getting an idea of flavor and style, the 3rd place "Sandwich" award that is below Gabriel Lee's FAC Sabre







For the past four (4) years now, our chapter (IPMS MONTEREY) has very successfully hosted THE ANNUAL CYPRESS SCALE MODEL SHOW.

Having this experience and know-how for the hosting of this kind of affair, we are in the process of putting together another show for later this year, that we hope will be the sort of show that you will all want to come to. The main purpose of this show will be to bring together the modelers from all the chapters in both REGIONS 8&9 for a weekend of good times where we can renew old aquaintences and make new ones, talk some shop with modelers of other areas, and get involved in a bit of friendly competition with the planned contest that will be the center feature of this event. For too long now there has been very little contact between our respective Chapters and Regions, and we here on the MONTEREY PENINSULA, feel that now is the time to get back together.

HERE ARE THE DETAILS:

DATE: DECEMBER 9&10 (SATURDAY and SUNDAY) 1978.

PLACE: PISMO BEACH CALIFORNIA. WHY PISMO BEACH? Our choice was prompted by two things. One being that SAN LUIS OBISPO COUNTY is the border between the two Regions. 

This clip was in middle of full page handout done for passage to members in May 1978 which covered many local items of interest for June/July '78




