




Besides that, what better way to get real time idea of how well we "get word out"?





So, instead enjoy more looks at this intriguing piece of 100 years ago in armor


Peter Long has another "Isherman" project underway. Quite a mixture, no ?



Alumnus "Dual Passporter Free Hornet/SVSM" David Newman, now a long time veteran of IPMS –AVG, showed up with this latest marvel from his Muroc Models company stable. Dave's resin casting of the Curtiss HS-1L is a fine tribute to American engineering skill, then and now. The artisan who built it? Someone who has taken home MANY awards around the country over the years. Cockpits are at times, a real challenge to shoot pictures of and have them come out "more interesting than just that", at least for this Editor. Richard was using my camera, not one he's familiar with by any stretch. He was also shooting pics in a very tight schedule for me to have a record of what had come to be entered at the SVC Four, and he showed his big skills as a long time amateur photog here, so well. He took a small handful of " not the whole thing " shots in so small a window of time, and this being one, just a fine magic plus.

This pair in 1/48th MultiEngine Jet, just fabulous to me for subject matter and for these "renderings".

Since I'm not able to quickly refer back to full entrant data in this writing, no notes for crediting by name the builder of this "purposeful, elegant brute". Which is my single best take about the real MiG-31 "Foxhound" in character. Far more than "an improved Foxbat", a plane I grew up reading the various "scary/not" articles about during "the Cold War", this machine now has a model available to match the real deal as far as I can see. Nice work, and cool to see parked near another old favorite.





Mark Wong is a long time competitor in both SVSM and Free Hornet classics, and here again he's come up a winner.

This A-6A Intruder is in what is likely the US-Vietnam War period markings, while aboard USS Enterprise, for Attack Squadron 35 "The Black Panthers".

Very good, subtle finishing work, everywhere.

Not a huge surprise, Mark took a 2^{nd} with this one and one of the models he had to beat out was that MiG-31.

Again, the cockpit "life" shot is engaging in capture, getting as they do the modeler's work and photog's skill in both, as one.

Ah, the first truly "digital marvel" Weapons System from Editor's formative past. While amused by the "Hustler's female voice for crew warning" outfit then (the B-58 "Sexy Sally" system), Intruder's **DIANE** got him intrigued. As the credit went to " her " for why the USN finally had first truly " All Weather" attack threat for any who dared incur our wrath. DIANE was **D**igital Integrated Attack/Navigation Equipment, that was integral to this Grumman and a credit to her success.

Before you leave this article with idea that ONLY aircraft, submersibles, an occasional armor piece, warranted attention of the Editor here...






