Next "big picture" up, Dave Parks' Sturmtiger in 1/48th had no such pressure. I just happened to like it, wanted a "big shot"





Dave's work again, splendid as is presentation. He shared that if you get this Tamiya kit, don't expect to find any shell like he has displayed with the figure in picture preceding. NONE in kit is provided. Dave scratchbuilt that spectacular piece you see.

Gabriel Lee had two eyecatchers on table finished, too. Panama Military UH-1H in 1/72nd from Hasegawa kit, aftermarket decals







Striking finish on his civilian Red Star, the MiG -17 "Stoli" Airshow Performer in 1/72nd, a model he has had underway earlier at meetings. Gabriel got her finished in time to enter TriCity 13 Category 20 Airliners/Civil Air.

Lovely as she was, in that crowded field she was joining a long list of those who finished outside the first three.



Another side of Gabriel's Central American Air Force example helo for a larger look, and then a study of WIP 1/72nd Revell F.6 Hawker Hunter underway from "Judge Jim" Priete. He reported the model is a great rendering and he wishes they'd be more available. He got the nickname for the night from President, who co-opted him for Club Contest October, covered later.








As you may have surmised already, that wasn't Jim's Italian tank on right above. That's Louis Orselli's M13/40 Carro Armato in 1/35th, from the Italeri kit.

This "In Action" type book all in Italian, which Louis had scored in a recent visit to Dan Webb Books, was impetus to his bringing three of these not often seen Italian WW2 armored vehicles. The second, right here, is an Autoblinda AB41 or 43 also in 1/35th by Italeri.



Mr Orselli is a grand fan of the vac-form model and this example from Germany's Airmodel proprietor is one of the better kits ever done for an Armor vehicle in that genre. He clearly has augmented the basic kit.



Last of trio is the most intriguing and not just due to being one of those Italian Fast Recce Patrol vehicles.

Louis's Camionetta AS42 Sahariana is a 1/35th Vac!

October Hornets Club Contest "AIRLESS AIRFIX" Show & Result

For Those Who Showed Up, A Profitable Turn of Events As Progenitor of Project Provides Funding & a Nice Bonus






President Burton was sad at having finished nothing to be part of this fine challenge to the air orthodoxy. Spirits buoyed upon early arrival of a familiar but rarely seen built Airfix craft, even more a few minutes following this when several prizes were craftily put in his charge. With of course, a "special ops enhancement" for it.

Contest Sponsor & Catalyst Kent McClure supplied a generous pile of rewards, with First/Second/Third AND Bonus for Creative or Quirky or Most Interesting Entry. Translated into bald capital terms, 20/10/5 plus 5 dollars Bonus ... U.S. Government Issue!

Contest was outlined pretty simply at start, "Anything Airfix - **BUT** Aircraft!". Later re-titled by another member, Randy Ray as "Airless Airfix" which is how we will officially record results

No other restrictions were in place or implied, you were left to decide if entering an oldie or something brand new molding or new build would be your participatory means. No prejudice for either, merely hoped to get a nice turnout with a good variety.

As you will find out, three members ended up being the ones to carry the flag, and all with nice surprises in store which met the President's outlined desire above and paid off for the entrants.



Kent McClure had this idea and he came with two examples of how Airfix is more than a "1/72nd Air Model".

Unfinished but well underway, his 1/144th scale Russian /Soviet R-7 Space Booster with your choice of final top payloads!

R-7 in military terms is the world's first known true ICBM. "Sapwood" SS-6 was its designate NATO codename. The 4 strap-on boosters on a "trunk" core stage that is effectively, "second" stage booster, icon of Russian/Soviet space program. Still in use!

Soyuz, Vostok and Luna nose caps and a pair of Soyuz, Vostok capsules all part of kit.

Kent's main lament on the kit is that the requisite paint schemes are somewhat hard to pin down for specific mission launches.

A companion vehicle in not quite twice up scale (it's 1/76th) was parked next door, his Airfix Austin K2 ambulance of WW2

Here is a better view of the R-7 and payloads family. Far left, the shroud for the Vostok capsule which is second from the right. Second from left, the shroud for the Soyuz capsule, seen on the right. The kit parts are designed to fit over one another if you so chose to do so. The middle piece is a Luna shroud. These were series of robotic spacecraft from 1959 to 1976 for lunar missions







Airfix's Austin K2 Ambulance is nearly 50 years old now, and is in 'OO' railroad scale of 1/76th, not true 1/72nd scale. Also not kit separately, only available paired with Fire Truck which is also a real life Austin item, as the "RAF Emergency Set".

Kent poured a lot of love and effort into a kit many wouldn't have even attempted in these golden days of small scale vehicles.

The skill of the builder shines through in a project completed of this sort though, and I think many can see well how patient work and procured experience the hard way, paid off again for Kent here.

This Editor would have been in the vehicle had he tried it, and not in the driver's seat.










Cliff Kranz was working this same circuit in a slightly varied manner, in that these Airfix kits are in fact nearly originals...

All were conversion projects done "the old way in old days" although then Cliff and I didn't imagine this "modern day" where hard to find (and follow) print articles would be gone as digital everything and "search engines" would solve it all ...



Buffalo – first out in 1965, and not many years later Cliff made this convert of one into LVT (A) 2 for US Army in Pacific use, from an Airfix Magazine Article. We had that blessed reference to give us means to craft variety ©

Sdkfz 7 which Cliff made over into Sdfkz 9 (FAMO). Nice effort and combines the 88mm gun from the Airfix paired kit. However, he learned later the FAMO was a much larger chassis. From 1967.

Churchill – Born in 1961, which makes it oldest kit of Cliff's set but he made this one bit later. Another Airfix Magazine triumph with a brand new dozer blade by scratch. Boo ya!



Now the one that simply delighted the Editor, the RAF Air Sea Rescue Launch boat in true 1/72nd, first released by Airfix in 1979. Bob Meyers did this in fairly short order, inspired to take it on by Kent's call to arms with "Anything Airfix But an Aircraft". Bob let us know he had fun with this!



The President and Editor will be letting you know here he had plenty of fun trying to keep number of photos taken to share to minimum here as well.









Oh perhaps seems excessive to be putting this gallery together, I will not argue point.

Merely point out that when you go to plenty of meets, buildfests, Contests and the like, alongside shooting pictures at them plus a good dose of putting together a publication or two, well when a "rather rarely seen subject" has an appearance, worth indulging.




SA 1 "The BOSS" Best Of Show, Senior






"On The Beach"

Our Judges will choose for "On The Beach" for best subject as per title, which is embodying spirit of theme. Everything from ancient dimosaurs and obscure outlaws to famous battles, or creative wildlife dioramas. Alongside obscure but cool (+ available) options for "Oz in Space" in the Real Space model. Plus rich potential of Automotive Racing and also Australia's roles in the "Cold War" as more than a movie prop.

Director makes clear award theme encompasses ALL AUSTRALIAN & NEW ZEALAND history, subjects as potential. NOT narrowly FOCUSED in any way except as by reaction of entrant entries. It does not have to be made by or specifically for Australia or NZ, Aussies or Kiwis as tribe or nation. Nor be tied somehow specific to either of the "theme" movies, or World War Two or Cold War. As noted early on, they're merely an iconic reference point for convenience of framing up the Contest Theme

Making sure point is expressed explicitly. So none possibly losing with an "award winning stone perfect Aussie piloted Spiffire in PTO or an F-111C maintenance diorama" to an obscure Aboriginal walkabout diorama (gasp) or bust of Lord Humongous (now, that's a reach!) in final judgement of winner for this award, wasn't warned.


















Doing that would have been fairly easy and put builder eligible for SA3, SA4B, SA4C, SA5 Special Awards all tied direct to theme!



The Royal Australian Air Force has a pretty long and storied history. Likely many even now the event is past are not quite aware of just how many different aircraft types alone would have been possible to model for a shot at this award. The graphic for award only touched on the reduced set of greatest favorites among them, of Award Sponsor/Creator. There was even a way to "double or nothing" bet in here, for a canny competitor could have made one model of the six CAC built (Australian licence builder of the NA P-51D) RAAF Mustangs that were left to serve as "atomic targets" during nuclear tests in Oz.




SA 8 " Diamond In The Rough "


It may not be obvious, but oddly enough, there's plenty of Prehistoric material in Land Down Under. Particularly abundant for study of footprints!


