Here again in now obligatory "Don't Be Taking Pictures of Me, Burton!" shot, was our new MP (Meeting Presenter) Mr Jim Priete. In true Hornets fashion, he's also still keeping at the helm of his long time post of Raffle Tix Chairman... after all, it's lifetime appointment.

And as promised, now it can be revealed, what the "rest of the table was" as an opening for Burton to shoot picture opens up

February 2018 Nest was to prove a nice variety of surprises as you will soon see, starting with a startle of dear Louis Orselli ...



As seen here, with Louis giving me the "What the ...?" return gaze whilst unsuspecting Gabriel Lee looks over at next topics.



NAMELY, Louis O's trio of Tigers and a bit of Thunder under way, with an updated edition of Daniel Ford's "Flying Tigers" bio of the AVG, which Lou is long time aficionado of. The book was from Dan Webb's famous book shop, we were informed.

Only the barest of notes were taken by the Photog, so bear with the paucity of information given here.

This is a $1/32^{nd}$ scale early mark of P-40, not noted by which kit producer, nor what finish plans were for it.

A good look at the fine WIP underway though as this cockpit peek shot hopefully demonstrates:





Louis had another WIP P-40 WarHawk in 1/32nd underway a bit further along, and it appears to have been an earlier vintage kit.

The scheme in best estimate is AVG colors, and thusly a Curtiss "B"





This P-40B is in USAAF OD/Neutral Gray scheme, and is in 1/48th scale.

Likely in view of the propeller assembly the kit was Monogram's early '60s molding, as stated earlier there were not a lot of detailed notes taken by Editor here at this meeting.



REALLY NICE WORK here, Mr. Orselli!

AND WAIT, THERE'S MORE (as stated, some Republic Thunder...)



WIP by Orselli, the classic 1/48th scale P-47D Thunderbolt, Editor damned sure this is none other than Monogram's own molding.

- If I'm in error, Louis can correct me for posterity here in coming month, as this news again being put out as published AFTER intended date (just prior to March meeting)







Sharing same table space with Louis , even if not scale, were Gabriel Lee and Kent McClure, seen at left. We'll start with Gabriel's varied lot here.







While circling ominously above, was Gabriel's creative go at rendering a postulate secret weapon of Austin Powers' nemesis, Dr Evil. *YES*, <u>SHARKS</u>...*with LAAAY-ZZURRS* on their #%\$&@##ing HEADS!. Mr Lee wisely began with Pegasus Models Great White Shark and went from there . Oh, YESSS !



Gabriel rounded this all out with an in the box to examine, kit of the Super Tucano.

As aforesaid, Louis O, Gabriel L, and Kent M all were sharing Model Talk display space on one table, here's one last look at entire set as we close in on Kent's Menagerie at the far left corner, and below

As promised earlier, an unobstructed look at the Model Talk Table on the left, earlier obstructed by a 1/1 scale Babbitt model ...

We will start with Bob Meyers' swift build of the new Tamiya 1/35th Sherman M4A3E8, givig opposing views on itself below:





I do recall Bob giving spirited extol of just how sweet and literally swift this build was for him, after having been in the worlds of Takom, Hobby Boss and ICM fairly recently, not to forget also the ancient Airfix 1/72 RAF Rescue Boat he did for a Hornets Club Contest not long ago. Bob is a clear proponent of having fun building your models, always the right thing to do, thank you

Also sharing Bob's passion for fun in model building and sharing such, along with more thanks from Editor for his unflagging club support in same category as Kent's, Gabriel's, Louis's and Bob's, is Mr Cliff Kranz. The builder of this big lineup below!



Cliff has this pair of 1/35th WW2 subjects to add to his huge finished collection, one is a "repurposed" Wermacht halftrack with USA (for United States Army, FYI) emblazoned along with the white/red crosses to designate this as ambulance/medevac Cliff noted this was from a period photograph, and a long planned project. The T-34/85, I did not get any details noted, sorry.





The Northrop P-61B Black Widow here by Cliff is postwar, a 1/72nd kit as is the North American F-82G Twin Mustang in front.



A look at the tail markings of both Night Fighters here will likely belie fact they were part of same squadron at some point 🐵

As for which kits, the Twin Mustang is for sure the original Monogram 1/72nd issue which provided Day or Night version components and schemes.

Cliff has a fondness for the older kits and knows very well of the issues with the much more expensive Special Hobby F-82 kit which is less than 10 years old ! (Monogram's dates to the 1970s...)





This P-61B is likely the DML issue which is a very nice mold despite the unfounded opinion of "it's unbuildable" held forth by a certain "Authority on all things of Scale Plastic/Resin" over the years.

Proof in this build and fact that the Editor built one each (A and B) out of the DML box, plus one "B" on his shelf as gift build for him by another who's truly great Scale Modeler in many genres, also knows when not shoot his mouth off with "expert opinions" Visible just off the wing of Cliff's "B" Widow is his pair of "Buzz Bombs" in 1/72nd. One is done as a WW2 German Fi-103, in green/hellblau. The colorful companion is the US Navy's first sub launched missile, an LTVN-2 "Loon" which was a Ford Motor Company built and "Americanised rethinking" of the Fieseler product for US Military postwar employment. The USAF tried out the JB-2 designated version for air launched surface impact missions (granddaddy of Rascal, Hound Dog, SRAM et al)





least, Cliff had finished his 3rd kit of this recent East European molded kit of the classic HUP (USN/USMC) or H-25 (USA) Retriever or as shown here, "MULE" for the US Army.

Last but far from the

Cliff made clear if you wanted to do this helo right this was the kit to get, forget the Mach 2 or the A Model. So is indeed sad that the Editor didn't get the identity for it.

Another in the community of prolific skilled builders who "do it for the fun of it, and no prejudice for types" (in other words, someone who will and does make model of many different types and scales) showed up with this fine Marder III in a vignette.

None other than Dave Parks here, and his 1/48th scale piece here is I believe, a Tamiya based vehicle and the figure.





This is an art form indeed, and I wish we had a article from Dave for how he created the Doric column and other parts of his fun here, just to fill us in better and selfishly to also help the Editor make schedule with " unique content " for BUZZ Every bit of detail everywhere, just has that sense of "belonging" which helps make this all work for those viewing the piece.








OH WAIT, that was supposed to say clearly Frank Babbitt is now working on a Mirage... or is this a photoshopped 1/48th kit in hand?

Yeah.






Ray kindly consented to hold this PDA for a picture, but has no idea where or who put this image up on his screen
