

LTV A-7 Corsair kit. An imagineered plane, Cliff explained he first created one years ago in 1/72<sup>nd</sup> scale after seeing something like it in a news show. He is now trying to expedite finishing this larger version which he began a good while back (two years or so) Cliff is never daunted in his modelbuilding effort. This is another example of how so. Next up, two more German tanks!



While I did not take good notes, I do recall that one or both of these are not actual WW2 German tank prototypes, but more on the order of what if explorations by Cliff, who has done many scale renderings of the Panther





Again, plenty of Wings and Wagon action in Scale Autos were evident amongst the 1000 plus on day's display








Okay, yes these were in the Vendor area and not built to enter, so technically not stretch to say "Wings" for the show
