

Eerie, even after all these years, how even in some small obscure way, difficulties with $1/72^{\text{nd}}$ scale Douglas Skyhawks involving innocent members of the Fremont Hornets still somehow be wending their way into our lives...Oh, well, I digress.

Recommended. Good enough to get Mike Meek to show up, too.


Next, three items from Chris B

The Macchi in 1/72, Chris was hoping to have ready to travel to Seattle IPMS Spring Show April 23, as an entry. He finally finished it and used the "hobby death practice" of (gasp!) DECALS to make those exquisite WW2 Italian AF desert camouflage green squiggles. Most delightedly, I'd say.

SECOND PASS OF USS HORNET MUSEUM MODEL EXPO of 2021 in REVIEW for YOU



So many reasons to be aboard the storied ship now a long time maritime & aerospace museum, making the Third Model Expo aboard the USS Hornet another!



This article is my second on this particular event, as I began it in BUZZ #92 (but had to push it out into

#93, due urgent news couldn't wait, about meeting) SO – here finally in the Spring I am able to wrap up as best I can, what my little slice of the experience which was the second of only 3 events we had in R-9 for 2021

This was the fourth time I have been to this ship for a model contest/show, long since after we used for meets






Yes, for those who didn't know, MANY years now ago, another IPMS Chapter whose members were in part also Free Hornets and/or SVSMers, used to meet aboard this very ship, monthly. In fact, Master Louis of our



Hornets was the last President of that fine outfit, IPMS-PTA (Planes, Trains, Automobiles) when we were on shore, no longer able to be aboard for meetings. <u>They were the first of Region 9</u> ever to stage an event here!

At that time, it was the local ship modelling group in conjunction with IPMS-PTA, Fremont Hornets and the USS Hornet Museum, who were the impetus that caused that first show. Alas, we have lost Ken Durling of the PTA (to a tragic run in with cattle traffic), the PTA (due to ennui), and lost touch with Ship Modelers somewhat due to losing dear member Dwayne Fowler, who suffered grievous injury while on business trip. So like I said, plenty of reasons to make the shows on the boat for me, along with too many memories...





Alright, catching back up somewhat real time now, this show in October 2021 which I am finally putting press to finish up. Ending wrapup is changed from what originally in mind, as recent news has come to me about this. The 3rd Model Expo had Celebrating USN Air as one of the main themes, and it showed up nicely in entries...
















The Rotary Wings may not have had a USN component but they did a fine showing of their world nonetheless

I didn't learn of who did these lovely motorcycles nor find which won what. But, really, it's appreciating the fact they were entered and in such abundance, really!






I don't know, somehow I just am fascinated by the Buffalo vehicle, and have to shoot pics of it every time

This 1/72nd "T-Bird" T-33A Shooting Star again reminded me why I just love this classic straight wing bird.




This War Hammer 40K Valkyrie by Games Workshop, also like the Buffalo, just captures my eye every time



There is plenty of reason to be aboard the USS Hornet Museum anytime as I said more than once here. But one May be really lucky to be there when one Alan Weber is also present and in the mood to take you on a tour of a plane he knows extremely well. Namely, the Grumman twin you see here, the terrific "Stoof" (S2F).

Ben Pada is being blessed here not long after I was, as Alan gives him insights aplenty about this S-2



If something seems awfully familiar about the S-2E Model you see below, there's a reason (or two...)



This is Alan Weber's entry at the event. It's an authentic rendering of an S-2E Tracker aircraft flown off the USS Hornet in her primetime, with AntiSubmarine Squadron 37, tail code NV. The work of Alan's here is a splendid example of his deep knowledge of this aircraft, inspired by his personal history with it. Alan's dad was a S-2 Pilot from back in the day, the deep sea blue S-2A days (when it was still it's original USN designation that bestowed its nickname, nee S2F-1 aka "Stoof"). While I know some range of matters "Stoof" as a long time fan (remember still the rattly pop sounds of the Moffett Field Trackers and their cousins well from my West San Jose childhood days, in and out all day long in amongst the Orions, Hercules, occasional Neptunes and oh my it is a CANADIAN plane, the visiting TDY CP-107 Argus), I have nothing of the range of Mr Weber's handbook.

As Alan gently related to me what I likely (and indeed, had) missed about the "real" S-2 on the USS Hornet that was presented as an S-2E, in fact was a nicely mocked up former "U" Bird...a US-2A in all likelihood. Exhibit is a great piece of work, really. Isn't detracted in its purpose by being a rough representation of the S-2E that the crew being memorialized for their sacrifice, flew. Suffice here to say, you really ought to go aboard and see this exhibit for yourself. If you like, know the S-2E actually has longer wings, tailplanes than the A or C, the U birds (Utility/Cargo duty) lacked ASW tail boom, MAD dome in belly, no ejector tubes in rear of engine nacelles for some of the key differences which challenged exhibitor's work in display. But like Alan's model, it's all good!



Like I also said, many reasons to go aboard, another being that the Apollo Recovery Mission of the Hornet is way cool and recorded here in so many ways. I have met one lady docent who is so steeped in passionate lore about the USS Hornet and Apollo, it's frightening to realize she was not even around when it all happened. I was and yet I didn't even get the basics when it was happening or decade after.



This is the "decontamination facility" the astronauts had to inhabit after return from the Moon, in case of any Lunar bugs of any sort were present. This converted Airstream trailer looks like a movie prop now, huh?



You aren't allowed inside as far as I know, but you can appreciate the sense of the thing still when you're walking around it, standing to view inside, and just let yourself roll back into 1969... NOOO LET ME OUT!!



Well I just learned that until further notice, NO MORE shows of this kind will be held on the USS Hornet Museum ship.



I will let you all off the hook with wrap up this time for good. With passage of time from fall of 2021 when this event which had "Builder Bob" buried in paperwork (see above) occurred, there has been a change of plan. At end of show, it was announced that in future this Expo would become The Ira J Keeler Memorial Model Contest/Show.



So it goes. We salute all the good folks who put it on, showed up to be part of it and thanks for the good times!
