



# SHOW AND TELL!!!



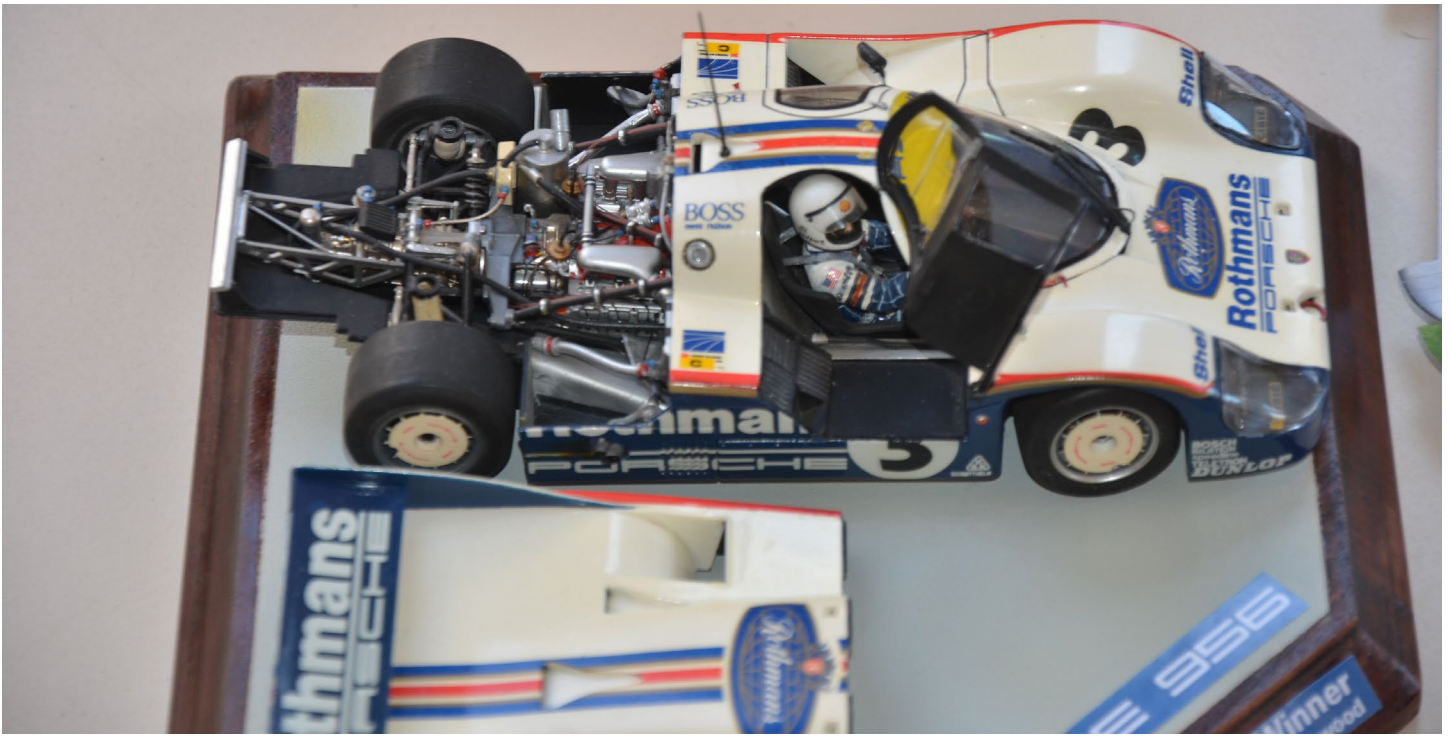

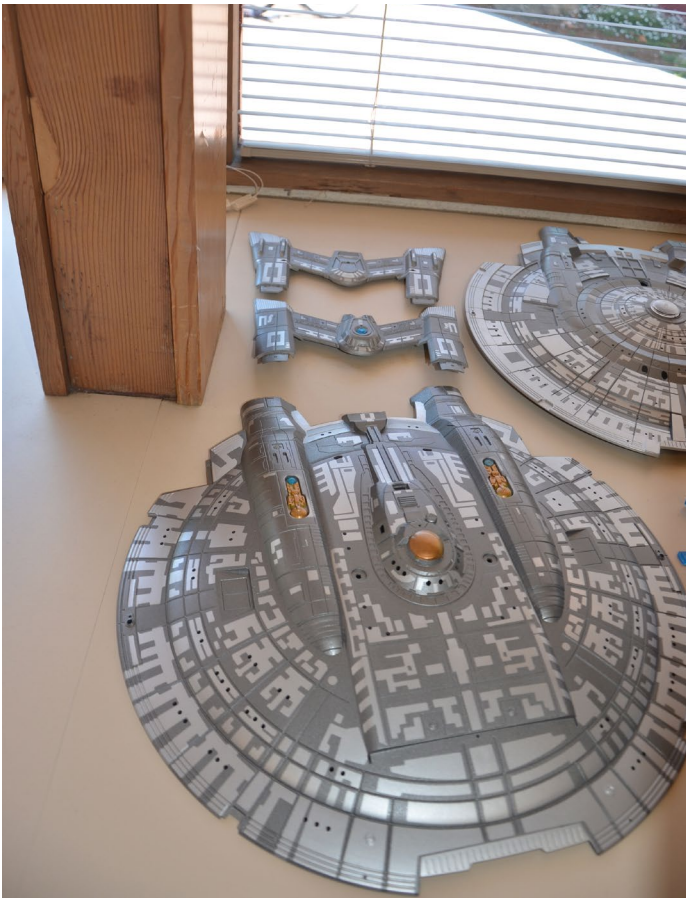

Dan came with 2 quality pieces. The first, a model of the Porsche 956 that won the 1983 Le Mans. It's a 1/24th scale Tamiya, with lots of remodeling. The doors were opened, the engine was wired and the engine compartment completely plumbed. The second was a 1/32nd scale Kitty Hawk Bronco OV-10, with lots of Edouard after-market stuff, and metal landing gear. Dan was heard saying that, "Kitty Hawk makes a great kits, BUT has lousy engineering", ...not for the novice modeler to cut his teeth on!





Next up was Sean B., with a Polar Lights 1/350th scale Enterprise NX-01, Starship. Just looking at the parts display gave me hives. So many pieces, such little time. He toooooooooooooo will try to have it ready for the Faire.



In the clean-up position was David C., with a 1/72nd scale Profile kit of a B-24 bomber. He hopes to have it ready for the Faire.



Well, I was in the pitcher's position...last...BUT, not least, with 3 months worth of STUFF. I have to admit, I'm running out of large scale busts in my genres to buy, that I can afford, so I'm dabbling again in 75mm and 90mm figures...still in ancient's and medieval's. First up was a 90mm Roman General, c. 100 c.e. Next, a 75mm Carolingian Cavalry Officer, c. 750 c.e., a 75mm Viking, c. 850 c.e., a 75mm Crusader Knight, c.1210 c .e., and lastly, a vignette showing two 75mm Landsknechts in combat. These were followed by 4 busts. 2 are of medieval foot soldiers. One has a crossbow, the other a large metal helmet. The kit did NOT come with the helmet, it was an add-on from another kit. I had to hollow out the helmet considerably to make it fit. The third bust is of a WWI B British Cavalry Officer, and the last, a "Night Witch", a Soviet female pilot greatly feared by the Germans. These women would fly over German positions at night and bomb and strafe the hell out of them.
