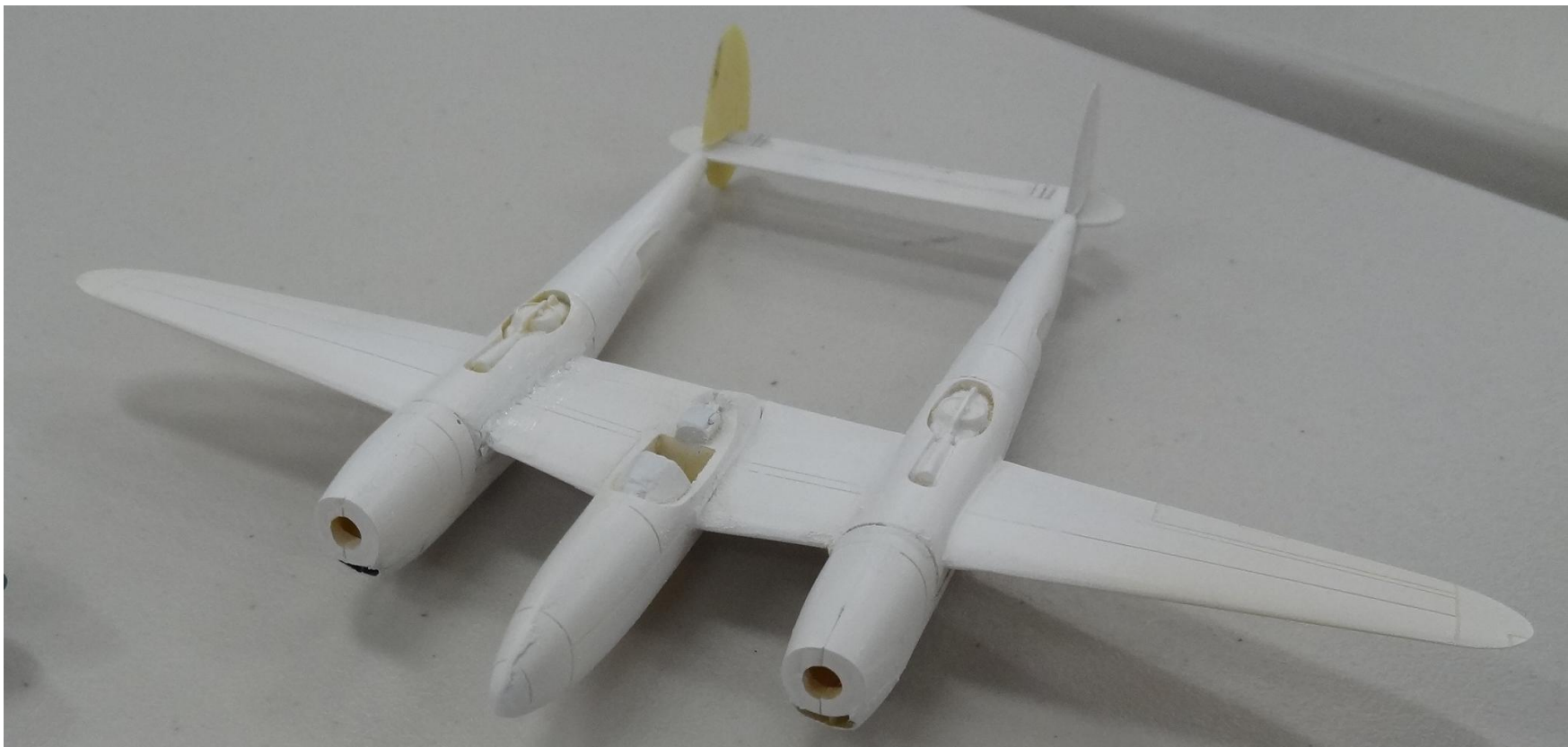


Mark Schynert making great advancement since last month on his twin engine demons with lovely lines, in 1/72nd scale

The XP-49 Lightning is a resin Anigrand kit, and provides all the same fun with twin boom pod fuselage align as a P-38...





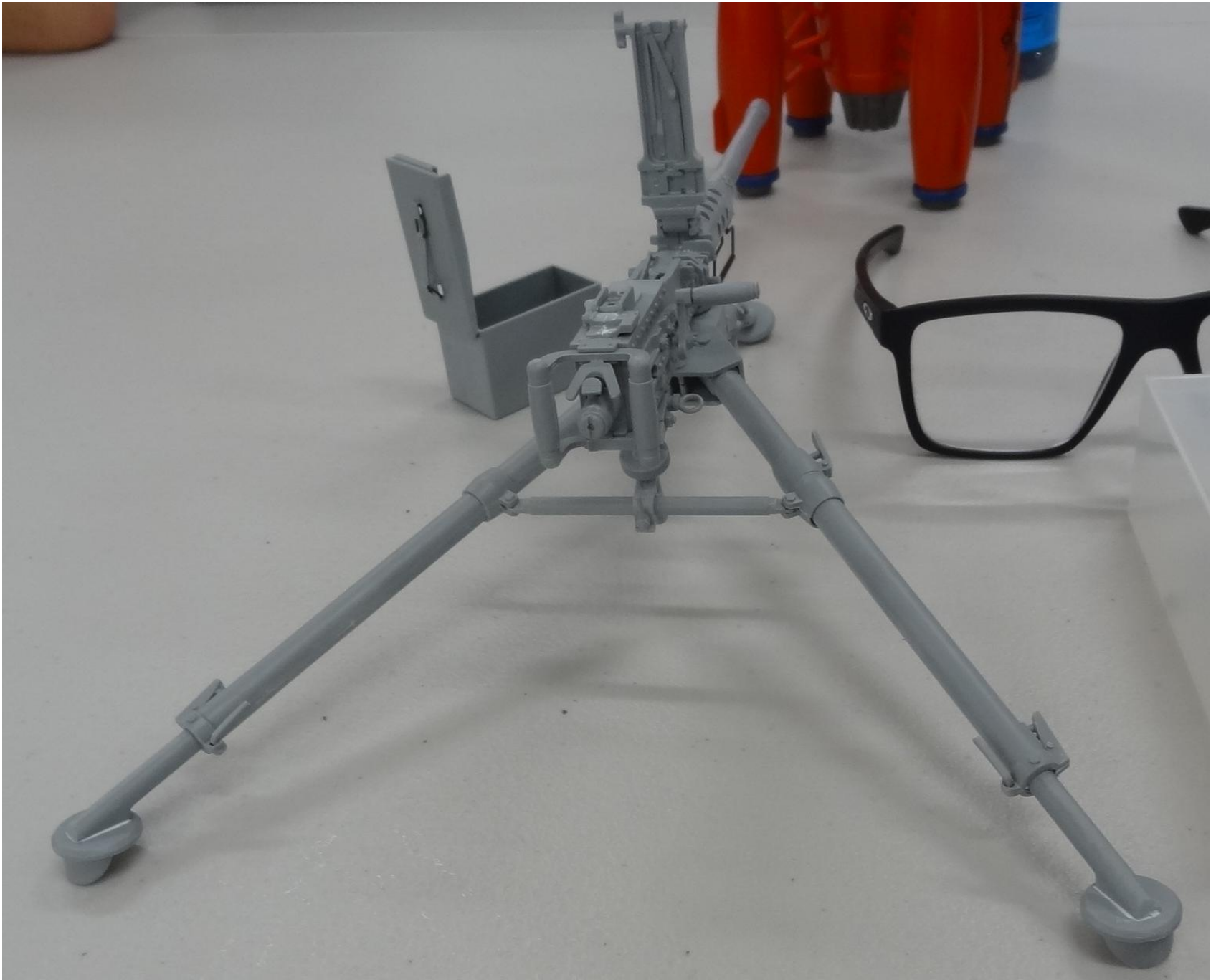

Now, for a possibly jarring juxtapose...

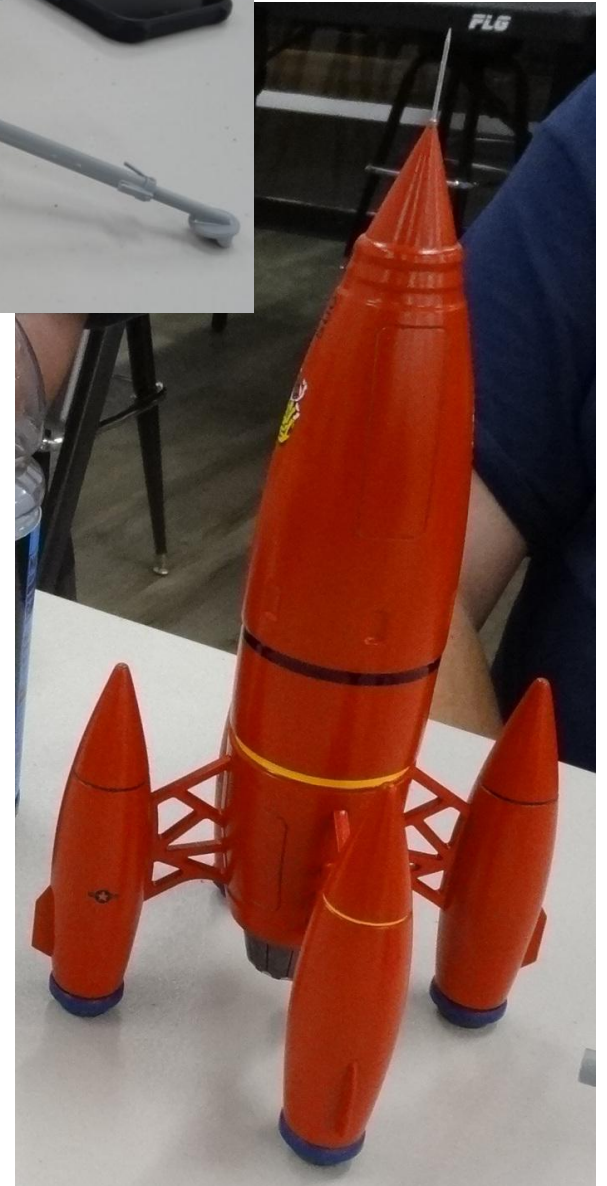


Think this is a .50 caliber American MG but again, just a speculation. Looks good

The Apollo 27 in 1/72nd is a Pegasus Hobbies fictional spacecraft designed to totally riff on 1950s early '60s concepts

Mark is restoring into colorful scheme of a test bed which will be very striking. He also had two entries in the “**RED**” event; a F-15J in JASDF anniversary scheme and a F-104 which I can only now speculate was either a Canadian or JASDF anniversary scheme

The grey Supermarine Spitfire F.21 of Chris's is moving along. He was charitably describing the F-106A Delta Dart here as a long awaited replacement for the now ancient 1970s Hasegawa kit, which turned out WAY OVER engineered in many ways.

Thank you MENG, for making it so this kit will be as much work as the old one, just in different manner. How modern of you.

New Member **Larry Heisler** had quite a project underway with the naval vessels. They are going to accurately portray the British Royal Navy ship that took on the Martian War Machines in H.G. Wells' 1898 ! novel “ *The War of the Worlds* ”
I am guessing the motorcycle project is just to relax with something easier in between...





HMS Thunderchild is the heroic “torpedo ram warship“, which ends up sacrificing itself and crew whilst taking out two Martian tripod war machines thus distracting them. So that the narrator along with others escape on a paddle boat that is amongst a fleet of escape vessels leaving the Essex coast. I have no details on how Larry got this all underway here.

Larry's motorcycle looks pretty good sized and is well underway.

As happens when one is conducting meet in a noisy room, all his splendid details were not caught by my ears, so check with Larry if you like more

To my recollection now, this below is the other rendition of the fictional HMS Thunderchild from the novel. Mind you there was a real ship class at the time of Wells writing, known as a torpedo ram, but he didn't specify the real one in any fashion. So now anyone artistically interpreting it is left pretty wide latitude. "A huge ironclad, with several guns and two funnels, sitting so low as to appear waterlogged..."

Louis Orselli did this SM.79 Sparviero proud, that camouflage was a carefully applied in stages process. That was no one sit down, all done.

These trimotor aircraft were pretty fearsome, serving well as torpedo bombers and fast medium bombers, also gained amusing nicknames.

There was even plans to deploy them as radio controlled drone bomb carrier. However, the first try suffered a radio failure in flight, pilotless SM.79 flew over ships it was aimed at, continued steadily on to crash into Algeria. War was over for Italy before program went much further.





Alan O'Neal brought the Desert Fox back to life on a smaller scale, nicely done.

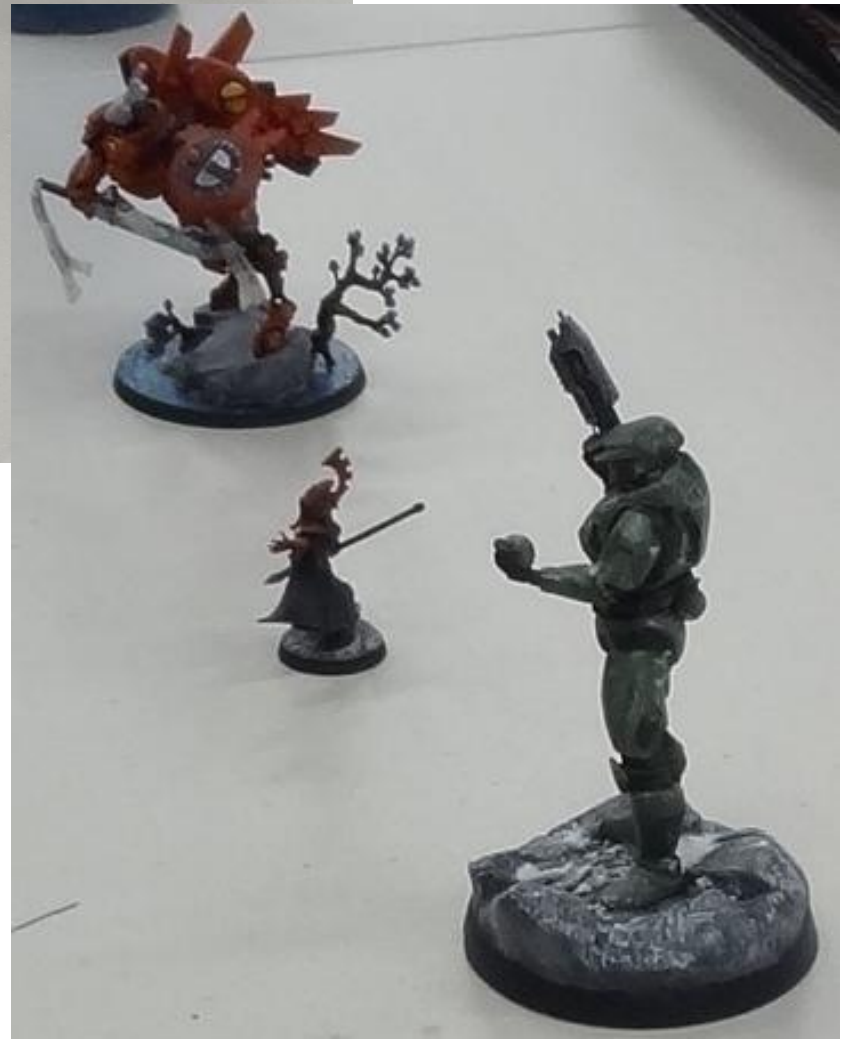

Ethan Larson had three mighty active warriors here, one of them was an entry for the monthly contest.





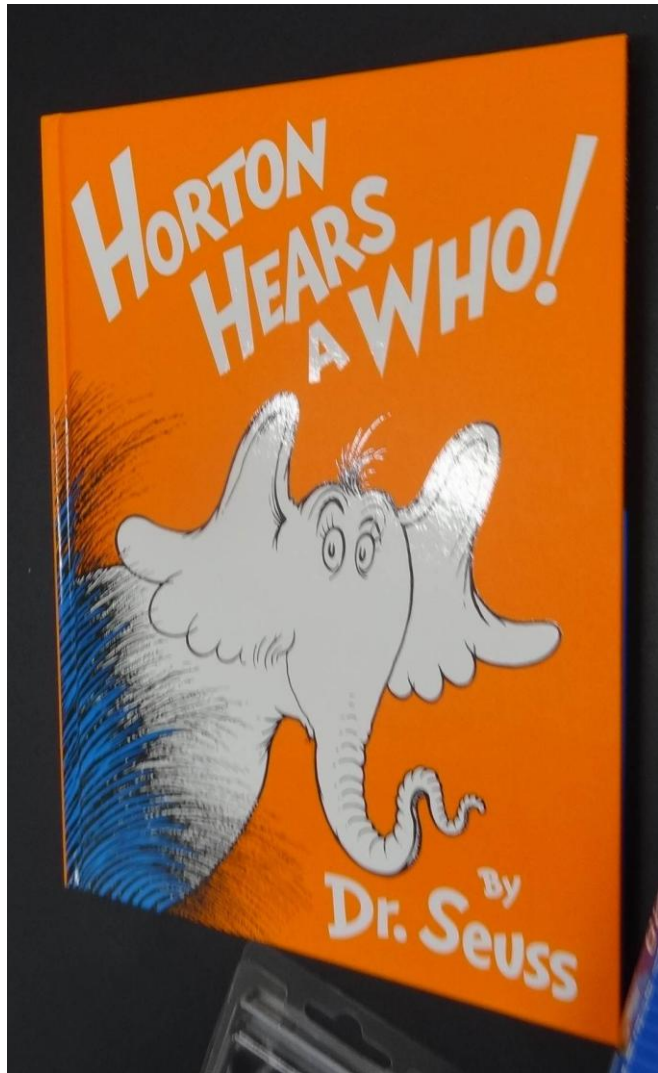
Ben Pada had his nearly done lineup of a 2 seat Zero, early Spitfire and J2m Raiden
