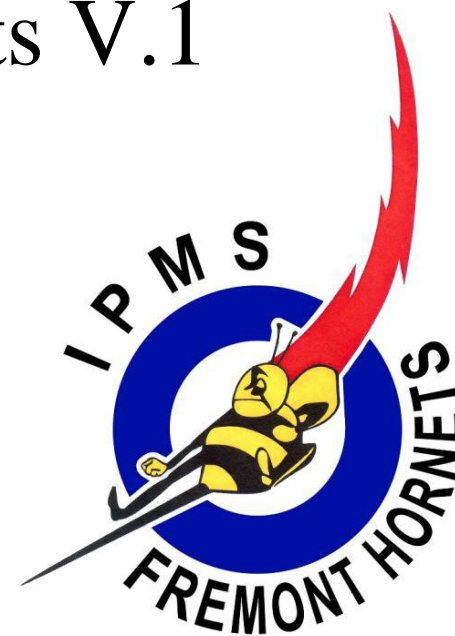

As this new to build box model of his would have taken up quite the real estate within our old accommodations inside the current shop.

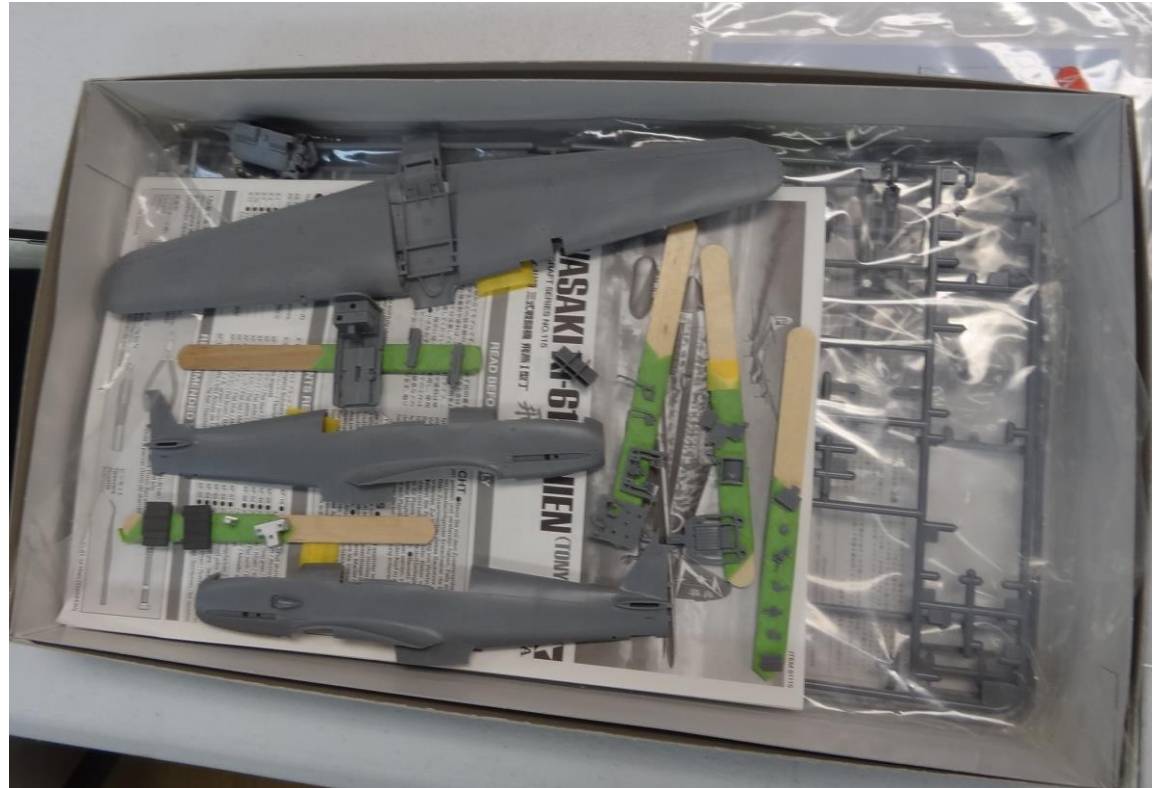

Itself another corporate example of consolidation and shrinkage over time, eerily nowadays close to how almost all of British Aircraft manufacturers ended up under one roof, BAC (British Aerospace Corporation). So General Dynamics was subsumed

into Lockheed/Martin (also another forced combine), long after a heyday built on the bones of Consolidated – Vultee Aircraft company (better aka as Convair) which was again a much earlier corporate takeover (Consolidated subsuming Vultee). Sheesh

Up next will be a look at progress being made by **Chris Bucholtz** on his Aleutians Island campaign Lockheed PV-1 Ventura and the 1942 Ford, both WIPs of course are in 1/72nd scale





Chris is pleased with the three tone camouflage turnout, looking ahead he said the fiddly bits like aerials, static discharge wicks and the de-icer boots would be only major pains from minor items still likely to bedevil him finishing. That and the specifically odd font of this specific patrol bomber in re: big white ID numbers. He has a solution in the works for that he said.

This ACE model kit of the extremely rare American Ford (in that 1942 model year of any make virtually did not exist thanks to USA full on entry into World War Two) 1942 4 door here is another of Chris's growing collection of USAAF support vehicles.

In 1/72 the available material is not exactly vast in scope or manufacturers, plus tend to be strictly military subjects. Chris got on to existence of this '42 Ford and ordered it to take chance it was worth trying.

For the most part, this has been worth all the obstacles to get this far he reported. It will be an USAAF officer's executive ride.



Leave it again to Ukrainian model makers to decide to do this kit at all, and in this scale, and have researched enough to know to that inclusion of a civilian option was available and might help spur sales. The El Cajon PD historians appreciate it I am sure

Before we continue this long delayed model talk missive, Editor again diverts to show off the spacious new semi private room



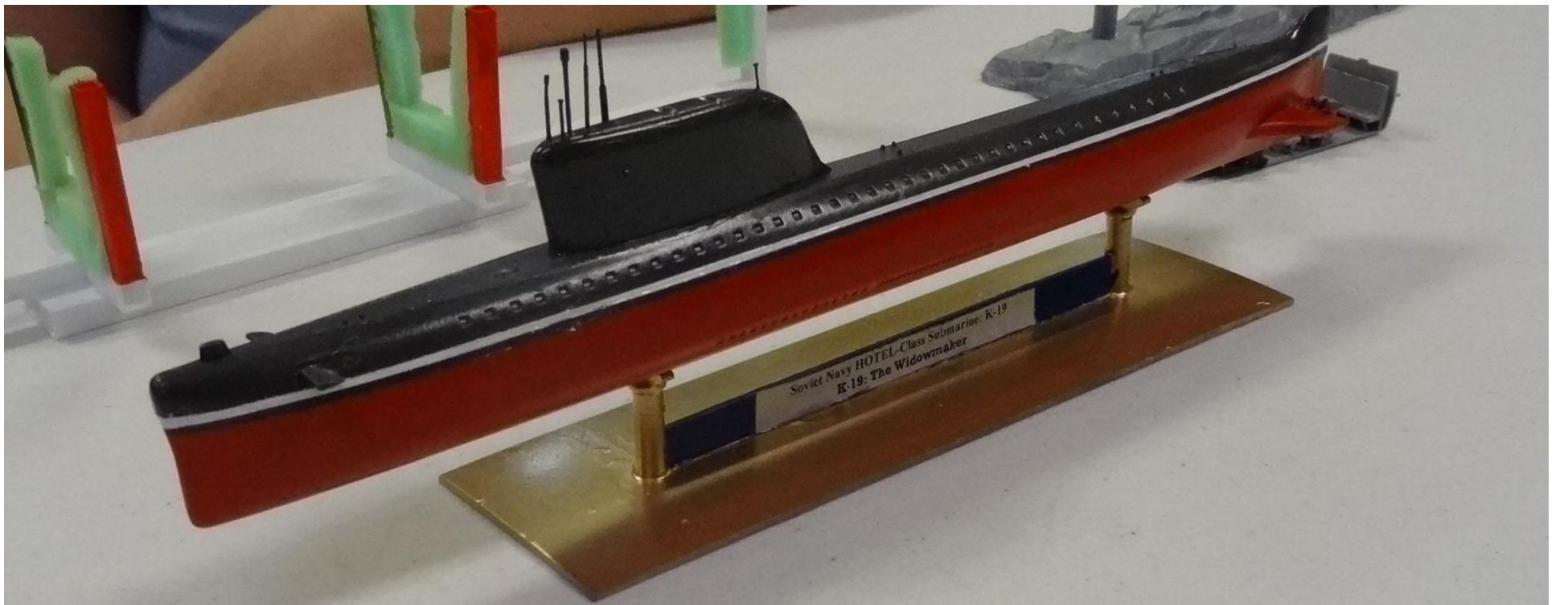
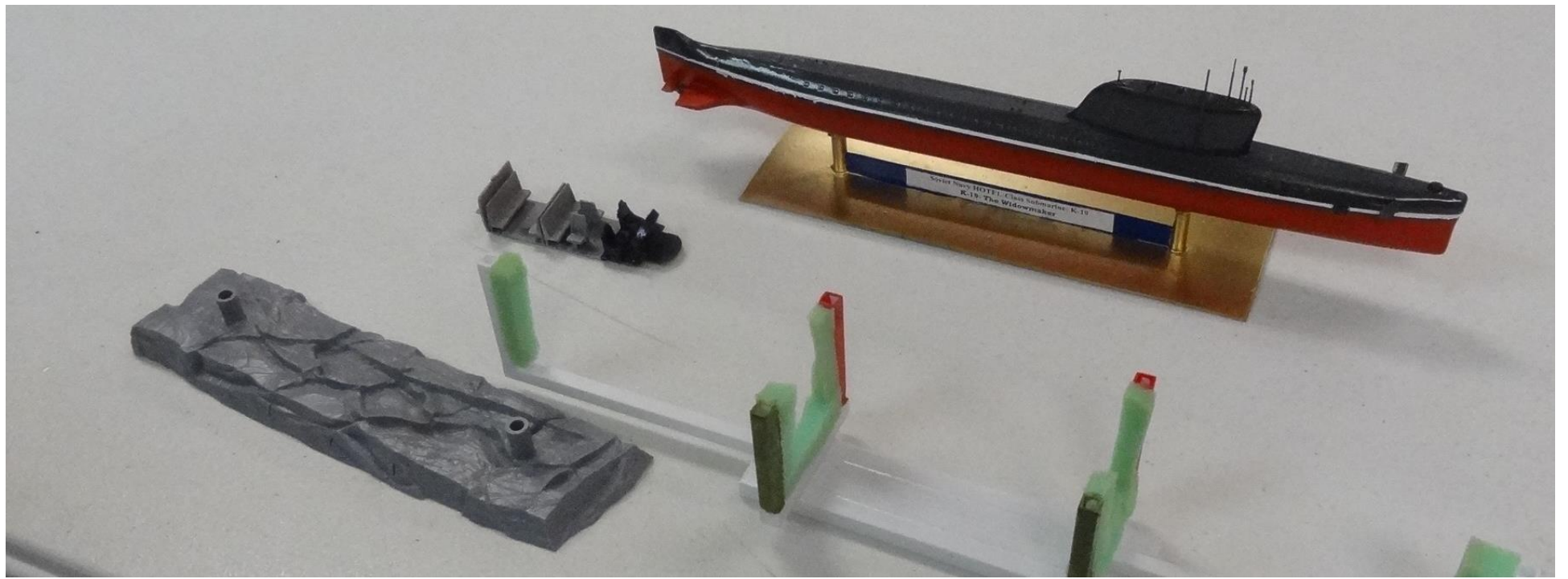

Mark Wong's now making the meetings more often and he has this 1/35th MLRS as a project underway, glad we had room !

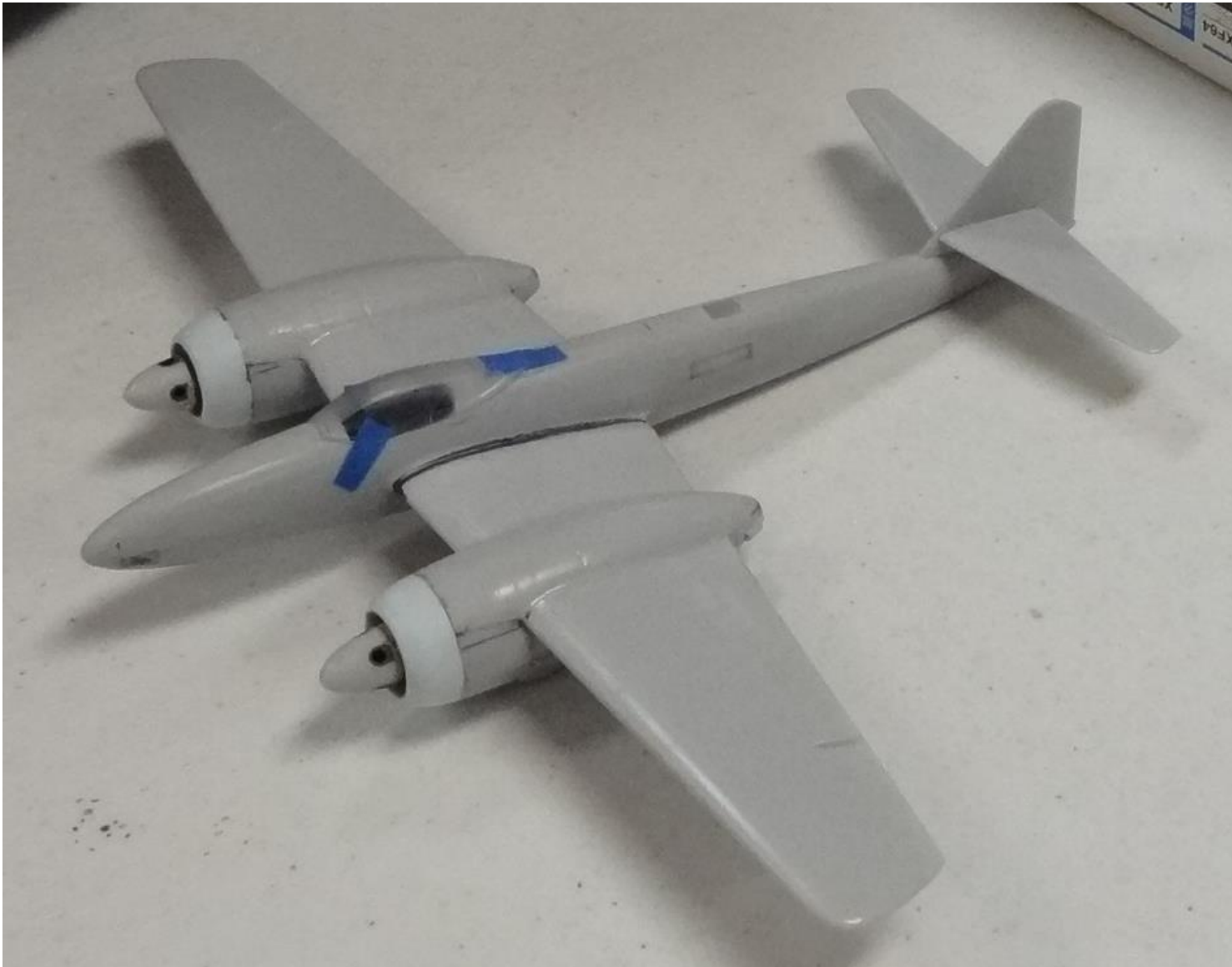

Jim Priete found himself in need of resuming work in progress with this sweet and obscure Mitsubishi bit

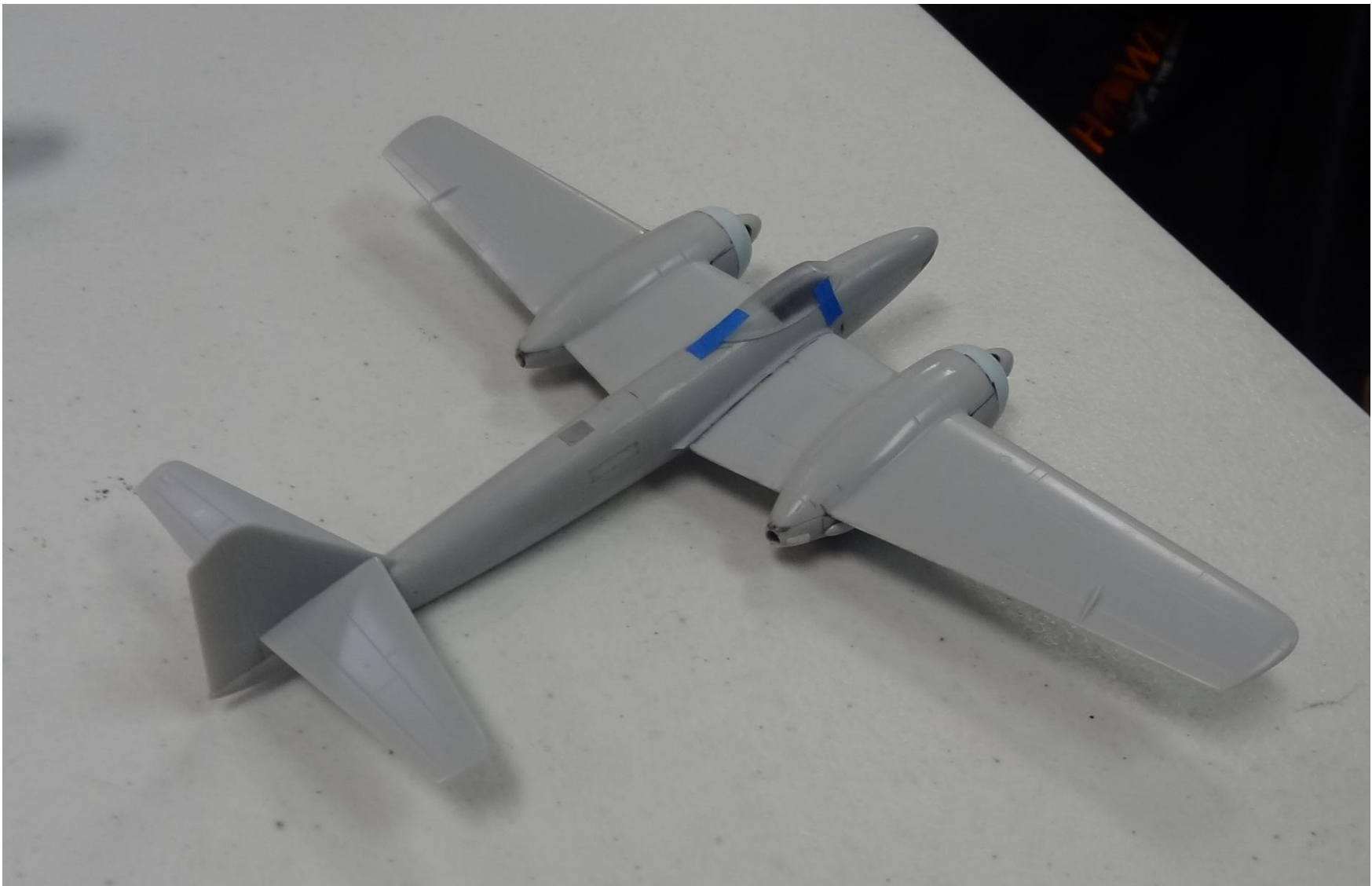
This is a Ki-83, which was to be the ultimate answer of the IJAAF to American B-29s clouding their skies.

Amazing performer in its own right, it demonstrated ability to do a 2200 foot diameter loop at 400 mph in just 31 seconds in 1944 as testament of maneuver potential in combat.

Flying late 1944, four of them being built by war's end, yet so secretly that Allies never knew of it to assign a code name!

Carrying a lethal nose mounted combo of two 20mm and two 30mm cannons, likely would have been misery for some Allied Aircraft had it managed to see any service with decent pilots at stick. As history records, scant amount of these resources then

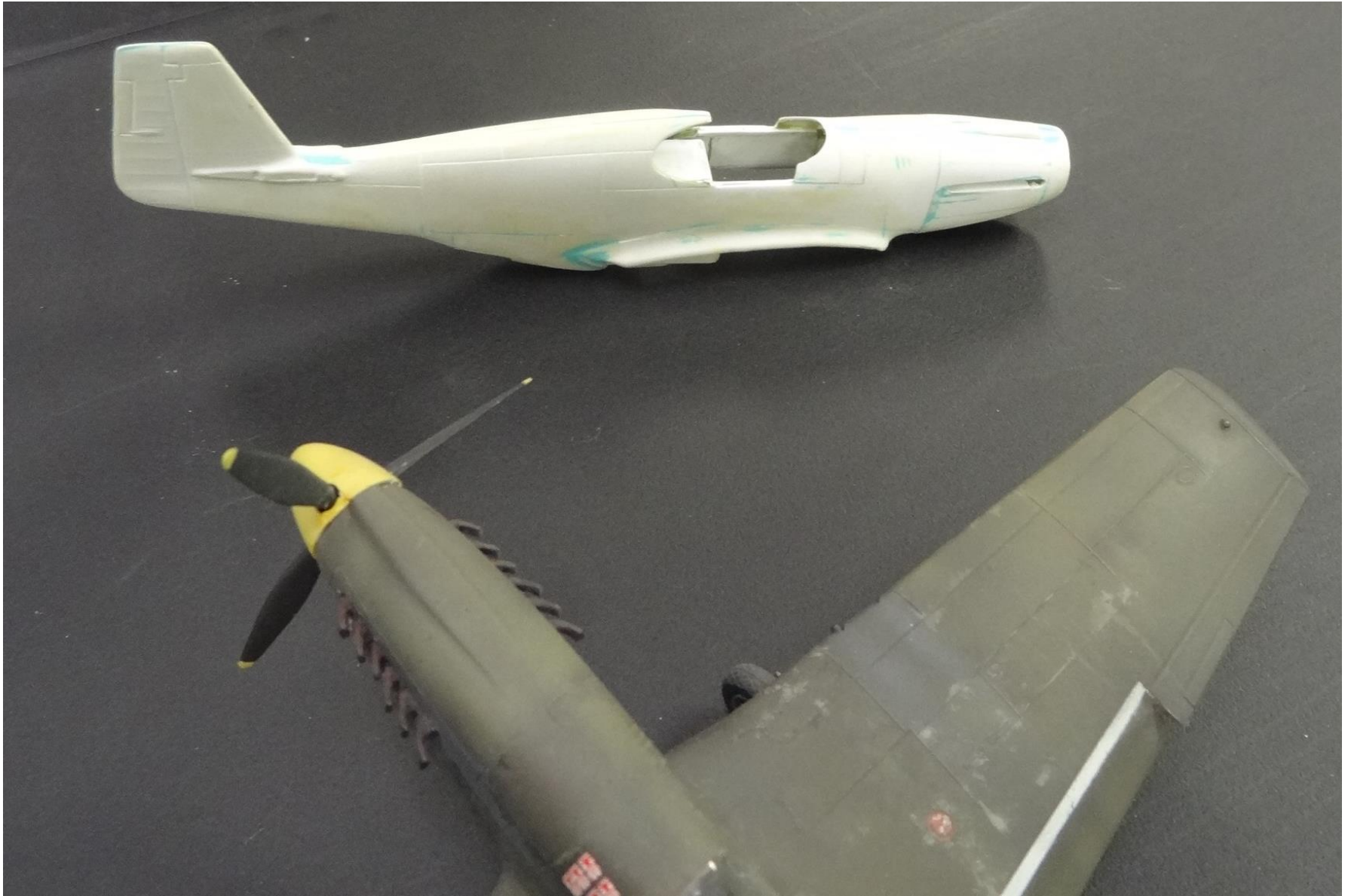

Silver bird is his latest go at recreating a truly accurate NA-73X, the very first Mustang, seen on left in photograph before crash

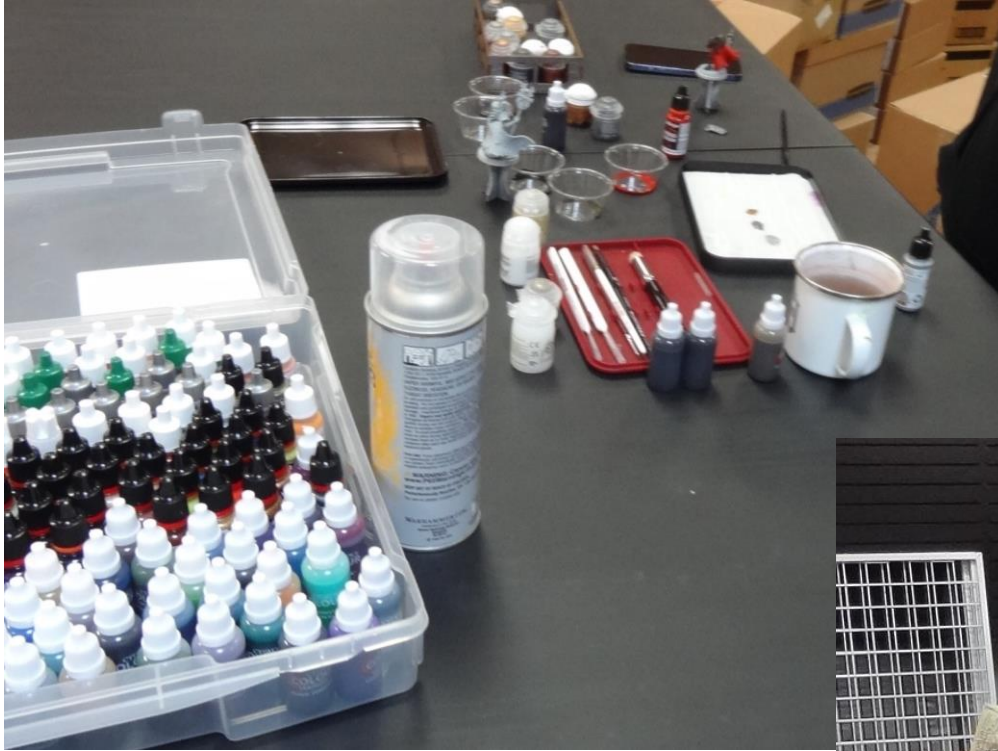


We'll wrap late edition of October Nest News with two looks at what builder memorably described as “a cute little French tank”



Angela Falvey definitely gave us something to add to our unique club character with that phrase, and her Tamiya 1/35 Char B.1






And last but not least by any means, say good night October here now to our Games of Fremont room supervisor, friendly Sydney B.
